BARREL-HOOP.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, James W. Brainard, of Pittsburg, Allegheny county, Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Barrel-Hoop, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 shows in elevation a barrel-hoop embodying my invention, and Fig. 2 is a ver-

tical cross-section.

As shown in the drawings, the hoop 2 is made of a strip of steel having at its middle an outwardly-bulging corrugation or corrugations 3 and having at the lower edge an outwardly and downwardly inclined lip 4.

The corrugation and lip make the hoop very strong, and the lip renders it easy to drive upon the barrel without catching upon the wood.

I claim—

A barrel-hoop having a middle corrugation and having at its lower edge, an outwardly and downwardly inclined lip; substantially as described.
