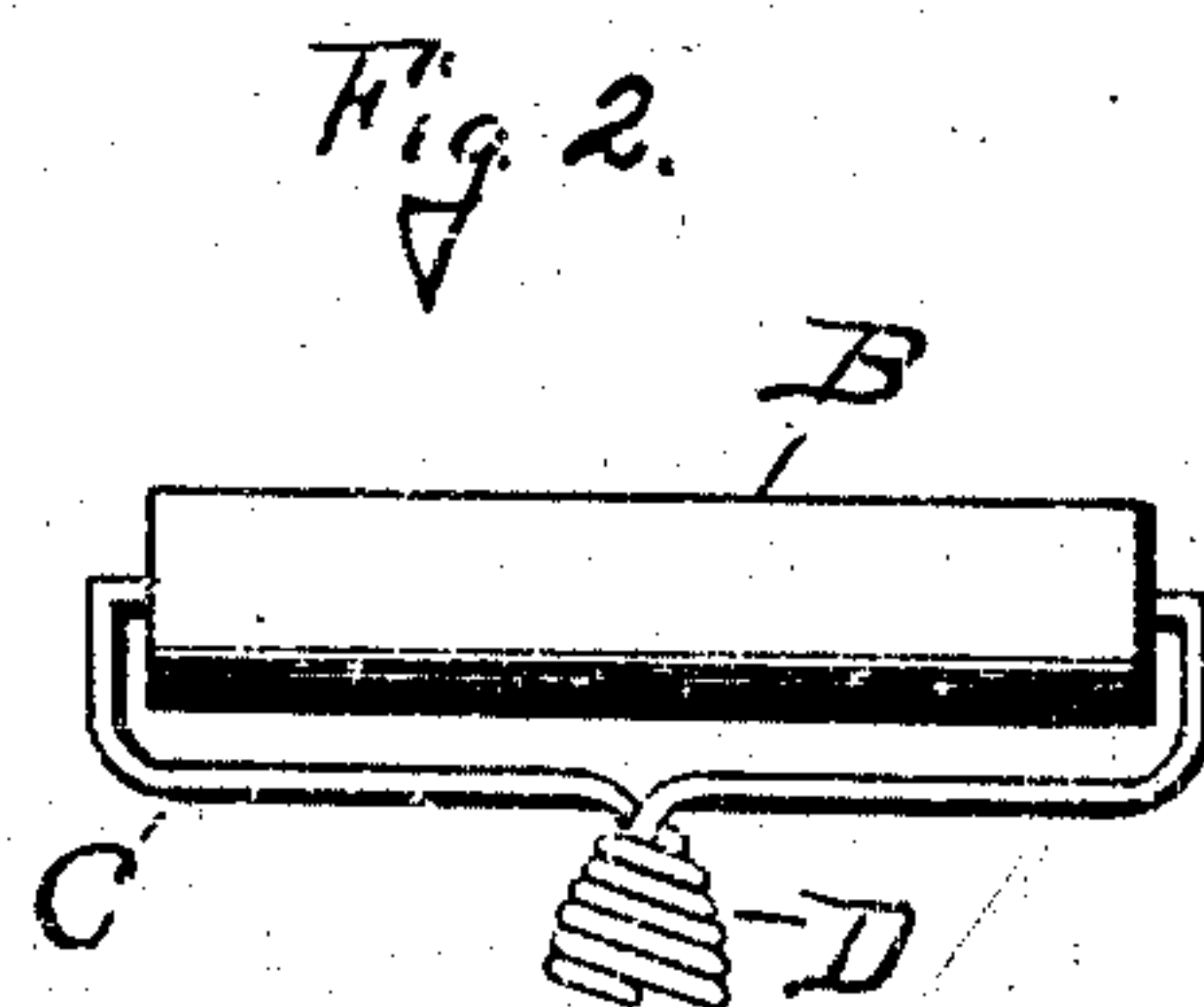
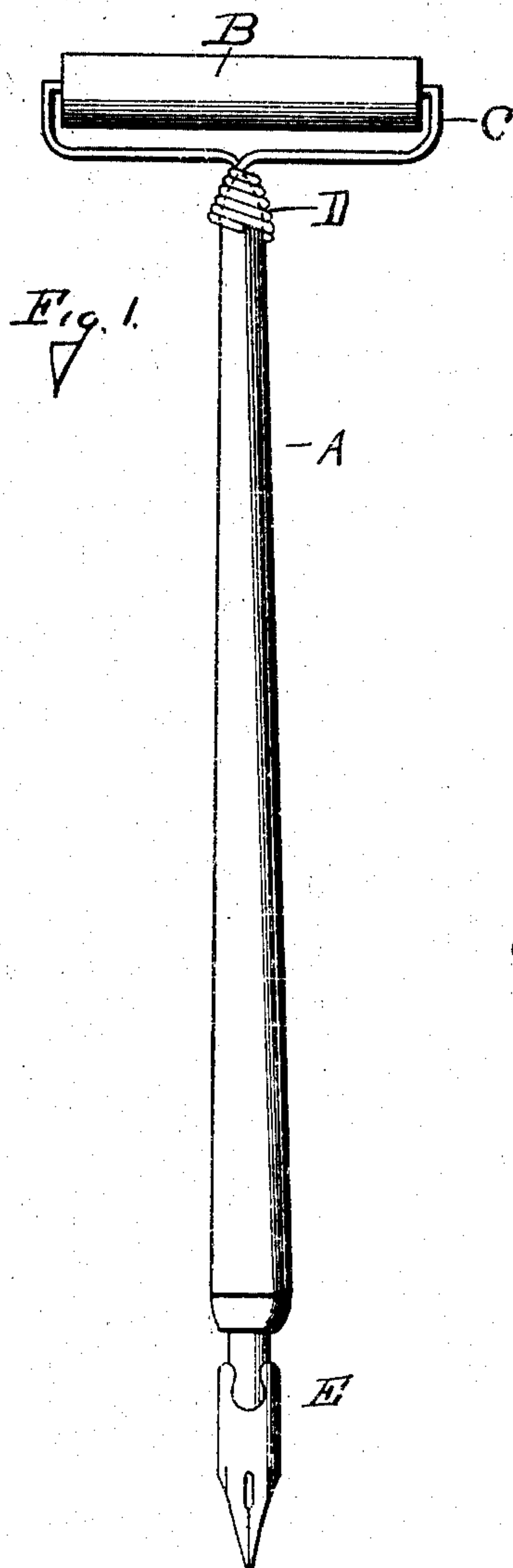

COMBINATION PENHOLDER AND BLOTTER.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that REGNAR SOPHUS ALBERT VON PINGEL, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful novelty in the form of a Combination Penholder and Blotter, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to new and useful improvements in combined pen-holders and blotters, and consists in various details of construction and arrangements of parts which will be hereinafter fully described and then specifically defined in the appended claim.

My invention is illustrated in the accompanying drawings, in which:—

15. Figure 1 is a plan view showing the features of my invention, and Fig. 2 is a detail view showing the manner of attaching the blotter to the shaft of a pen-holder.

Reference now being had to the details of the drawings by letter, A designates a pen-holder having a pen 20 E at the end thereof.

B is a cylindrical blotter having two wires C forming a bail, the outer ends of which wires form bearings upon

which said holder is journaled. The inner ends of said wires which form the bail are twisted together, forming a spiral conical-shaped socket D adapted to fit over the 25 end of the pen-holder.

By the provision of a device as shown and described, it will be noted that each wire C, the ends of which are twisted to form a conical-shaped socket member, serves to press the roller against lateral movement and provide 30 a secure socket means for holding the blotter upon the pen-holder.

What I claim is:—

In combination with a pen-holder, a cylindrical roller, a plurality of wires, the outer ends of which form bearings 35 upon which the roller is mounted, their inner ends being twisted together, forming a spiral conical-shaped socket designed to fit over the end of the pen-holder, said wires being adapted to hold the roller from moving longitudinally in opposite directions, as set forth. 40
