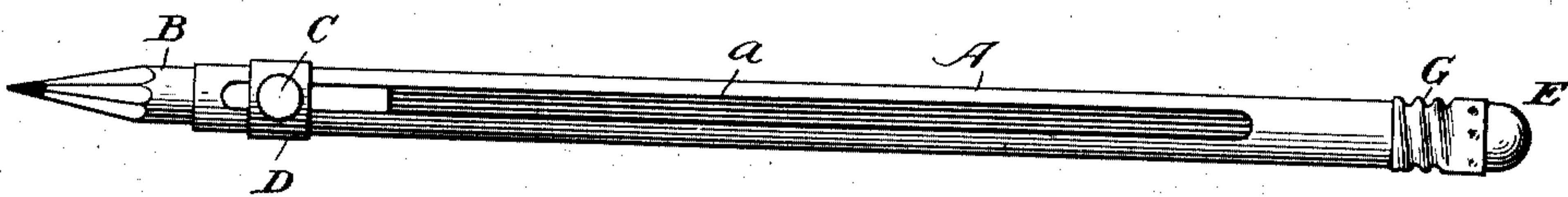

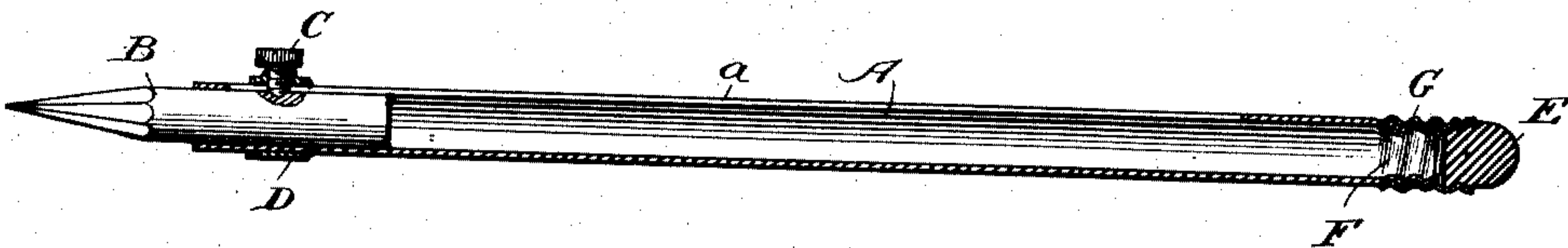

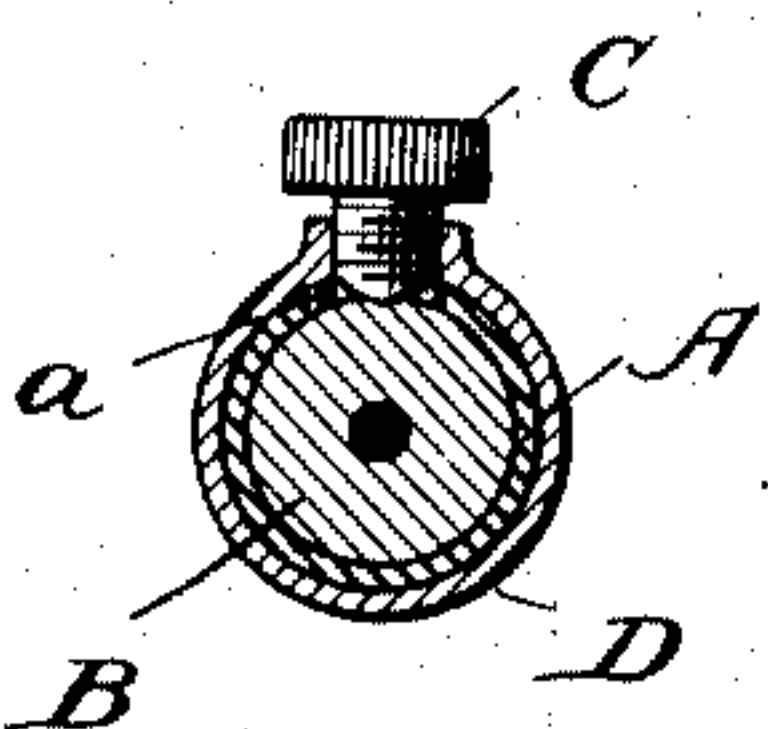
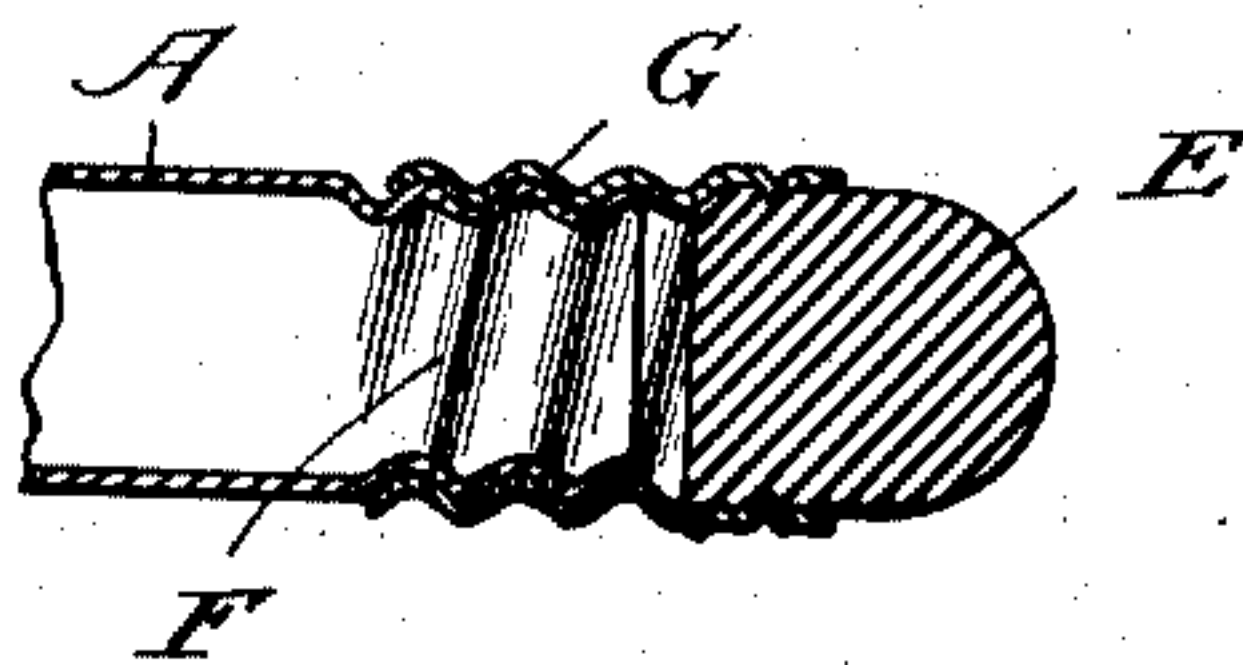

PENCIL-HOLDER.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH T. HASKINS, a citizen of the United States, residing at Portland, in the county of Cumberland and State of Maine, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Pencil-Holders; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same.

10 This invention relates to an improvement in pencil-holders and is especially intended to permit a pencil to be wholly used up, thereby saving pencil ends which would otherwise be thrown away and keep the pencil with holders always of one length.

15 To this end and for additional purposes my invention consists in the construction and combination of parts hereinafter set forth and claimed.

In the accompanying drawings Figure 1 represents a plan of a pencil-holder embodying my invention and the pencil held therein; Fig. 2 represents a longitudinal central section of the same; Fig. 3 represents a detail view of the collar and screw for clamping the pencil; Fig. 4 represents a detail view of the end piece screwed on and the erasing rubber held thereby.

25 A designates the holder, the forward part of which is

tubular and provided with a longitudinal slot *a*; B, the pencil, telescoped in this forward end and having no rubber or metal on it to interfere with sliding in and out; and C, the screw which works through said slot to clamp said pencil. This screw is mounted in a metallic sleeve or collar D, surrounding said holder and serving to prevent the dislodgment of said screw and to brace the same. The rear end of said holder is screw-threaded externally at F to receive a similar screw-threaded end-piece G, having an erasing rubber E fastened thereon. This end piece is easily detachable by unscrewing, to permit the substitution of another end-piece and rubber.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent is:—

A pencil-holder having a tubular forward end provided with a longitudinal slot, in combination with a pencil telescoped in said end, a collar surrounding said holder and a screw which is mounted in said collar and works through said slot to clamp said pencil at will substantially as set forth.
