

The lower tongue e is of the same width or depth as the flaps c and c' and is pasted to the inner side of the cover, as shown in the drawing. This helps to strengthen that part. The flap b is turned to the inside of

the cover, the flap c is then turned over and 50 fastened to flap b with adhesive paste or gum.
