

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, PASQUALE FARACCHIO, a subject of the King of Italy, residing at Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia 5 and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and Improved Cigar-Holder, of which the following is the specification.

My invention relates to a new and improved cigar holder with a tube made of as-10 bestos and mecrolite, to afford the smoker protection of the cigar against water while bathing and to be used at the sea shore, and to prevent the spreading of ashes by the wind and in using it out of water.

The construction and operation will now be described in detail, referring to the accompanying drawing, forming a part of this specification, in which

Figure 1 is the construction in its entirety. 20 A. shows a tube, J. the mouth piece with the cigar in place to be inserted in the opening C. of tube A; B. the neck of tube A., with a coiled spring wire around the same which is formed above into the spring coil D. with a 25 portion turned back as a handle E. which when pressed down, raises the bar F. and opens

the aperture in the wall of tube A. by lifting the check-valve to let the air in, to keep the cigar lighted. E. should be left free on sight of high sea, to close the aperture, I., a portion 30 of the check-valve that fits in the aperture to keep the bar F. from swaying, H., rubber shoulders resting against G. metal back to press the rubber tight against the aperture to prevent the water from entering.

Having thus fully described my invention,

what I claim as new and useful is:

In a cigar holder the combination of a holder, a chamber secured thereto provided with an aperture in the wall thereof, a valve 40 seated in said aperture and a spring secured to said chamber and carrying said valve for permitting the opening and closing of the valve substantially as and for the purpose specified.
