METAL-POLISH.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, EARL V. VORIS and PATRICK H. CARROLL, citizens of the United States, residing at Kirkland, in the county of King and State of Washington, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Metal - Polish, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to compositions for cleaning and polishing metal work, such as silverware; and it has for its object the provision of a preparation that may be put up for use in a dry and powdered form and in which state it will not be affected by dampness and amalgamate or cake.

A further object of the invention is to provide a metal polish so proportioned as to be exceedingly efficient in a dry state or by the addition of water, benzin, or other like vehicle, be converted into a liquid polish of exceptional merit and which can be employed in the manner of ordinary metal polish.

The composition of the present invention is made up essentially of asbestos, magnesia and talc, and are proportioned by weight as

follows: asbestos, ten per centum, magnesia, sixty per centum, and talc, thirty per centum.

In producing the new composition of matter the asbestos, magnesia and talc are thoroughly ground and mingled together, by any suitable means, to produce a dry powdered product, which may be stored, transported and handled and be at all times ready for use.

Having described our invention, what we claim, and desire to secure by Letters-Patent, is—

1. A composition of matter of the character described, comprising asbestos, magnesia, and talc.

2. A composition of matter of the character described, comprising asbestos, ten per centum, magnesia, sixty per centum, and talc, thirty per centum.
