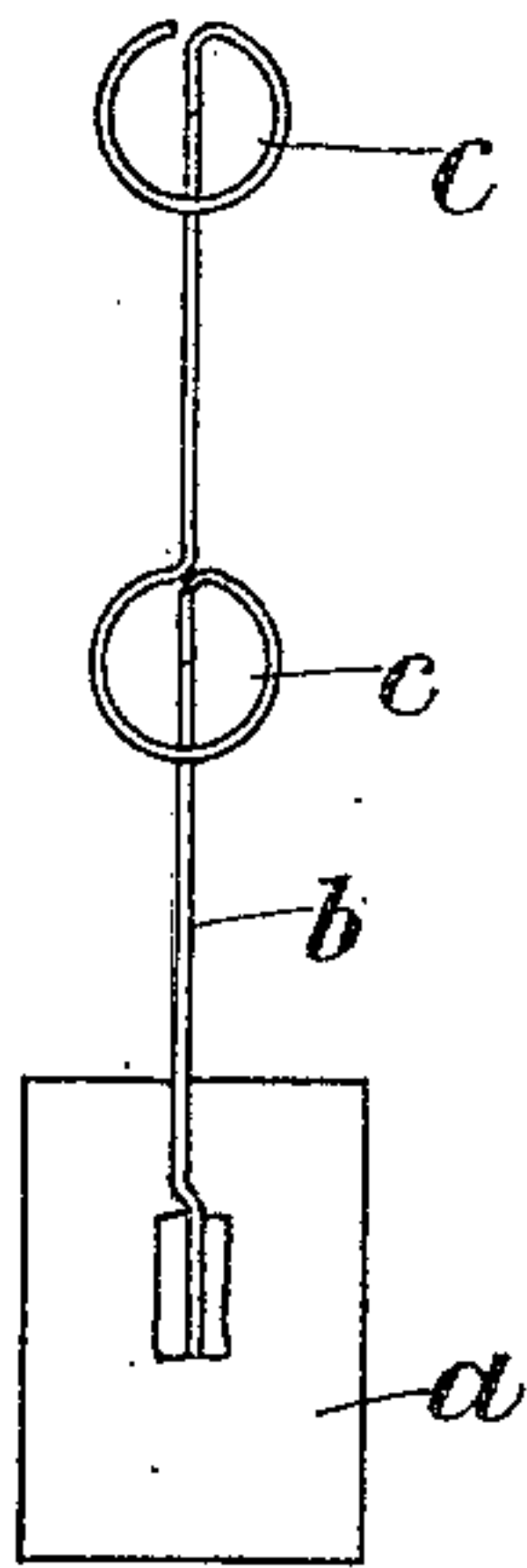

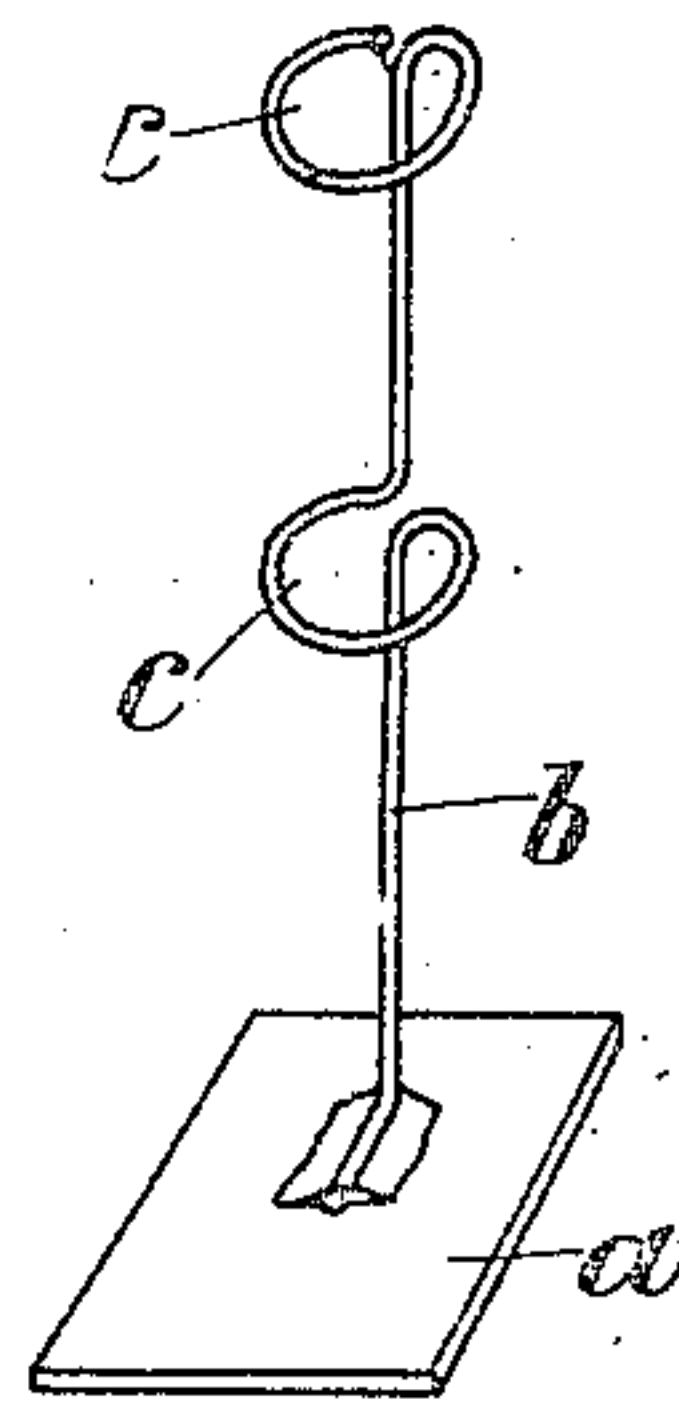

FOLDING LEAF, FLOWER, OR SPRAY STAND.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HENRY RANDALL HARVEY, a subject of the King of Great Britain and Ireland, residing at No. 7 Overdale road, in the county borough of Derby, England, have invented a certain new and useful Folding Leaf, Flower, or Spray Stand, of which the following is a specification.

The object of my invention is to provide a leaf, flower or spray stand for use principally in art classes, at a low price and which may be bent down flat for storage or packing for transit.

Referring to the drawings which form a part of this specification, Figure 1 is a plan showing my improved stand bent down flat for storage or packing. Fig. 2 is a perspective view of the same with the stem and loops bent upwards above the base ready to receive the leaf, flower, spray or the like.

In carrying out my invention I provide a base *a* of suitable weighty and pliable material such as sheet lead, to this I affix a piece of wire *b* to form a stem and in this I form

one or more loops *c* to hold the leaf, flower, spray or the like. When required for use the central stem *b* is turned upwards at the required angle with the base and the loops turned outwardly therefrom as shown upon Fig. 2. It is evident that the stem *b* may be bent to any desired angle or curve as also may the loops *c*.

Having now described my invention what I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent is:—

In a leaf, flower, or spray stand, a base formed of sheet lead and a bendable wire holder or stand having its lower end bent and secured to said base, the upper portion of said wire being bent into loops to hold the flower.
