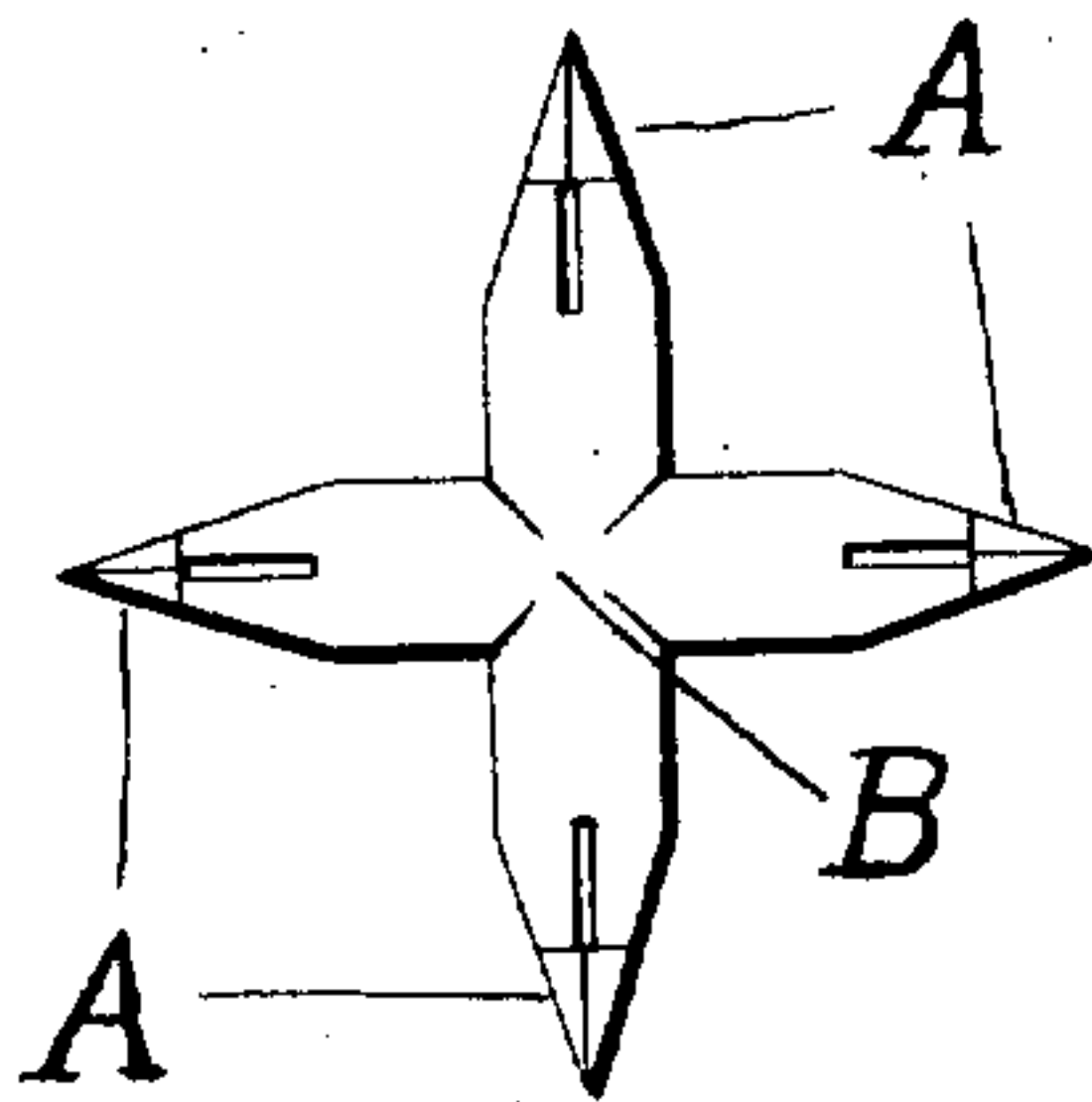

PEN-NIB.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CALLIE GEROME WERTHEIMER, a citizen of the United States of America, residing at 15 Nevern Mansions, Earl's Court, in the county of London, England, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Pen-Nibs; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same.

This invention relates to that class of writing pens made of steel or other suitable metal which combine two or more nibs in one piece. According to this invention, I stamp out of a piece of steel or other suitable metal a quadruple nib, leaving only a thin attachment between every two adjacent nibs so that as one is used it may be broken off and the next put into position.

In order that my said invention may be better understood, I will proceed to describe the same with reference to the drawing accompanying this specification, in which:— the figure shows a quadruple nib.

The above mentioned compound nibs A are stamped out of a single piece of steel or

other suitable metal by any suitable means, leaving the thin metal portion B joining adjacent parts of the nibs, as shown.

It will be understood that when one nib is worn out or spoiled, it is simply necessary to break the same off, to draw the compound nib out of the holder and bring a new nib into position for use.

The nibs made according to my invention may have the two points of the same character, or they may be different, for instance one may be a sharp point and the other blunt.

What I claim is:

1. A plurality of pen nibs joined by a thin integral attachment, and disposed at substantially a right angle to each other, substantially as described.

2. A plurality of pairs of pen nibs joined by a thin integral piece of metal, and each pair disposed at substantially a right angle to another pair, substantially as described.
