

BUST-SUPPORTER.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Jennie M. Bodensiek, a citizen of the Kingdom of Sweden, residing at New York, in the borough of Man-5 hattan, county and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Bust-Supporters, of which the fol-

lowing is a specification.

This invention relates to an improved 10 bust-supporter which is mainly intended for the use of stout women, and which has a certain degree of elasticity so that it fits the bust in a comfortable manner and acts in the nature of a bust-reducer; and for this pur-15 pose the invention consists of a bust-supporter which is laced at the front and provided at each side of the front-lacing with recesses having a plurality of transverse elastic bands, and which is provided along 20 the edges of the armholes with loop-shaped elastic shoulder-straps that are stitched at their lower portions to the supporter, as will

claum. 25 In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 is a perspective view of my improved bustsupporter, Fig. 2 is a horizontal section on line 2, 2, Fig. 1, drawn on a larger scale, and Fig. 3 is a side-view of the bust-sup-30 porter showing the shoulder-strap of the same.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

Referring to the drawings, a represents 35 a bust-supporting unstiffened waist-like garment which is made of suitable light material and according to the bust measurements. The garment a is closed at the back and provided with eyelets b in the front and 40 lace-strings b^1 so as to be tightly fitted to the body. In the upper breast portion of the waist a, at each side of the lacing-strings $b^{\scriptscriptstyle 1}$, are arranged recesses d, preferably of presence of two subscribing witnesses. rectangular shape, which extend down-45 wardly in said breast-portion. The sideedges of said recesses are unstiffened and connected by a number of transverse elastic

straps d^1 that are stitched at the ends to the waist a and covered by a strip d^2 , the edges of the recesses being preferably ornamented 50 by suitable lace or trimming. At both sides of the waist a are arranged openings for the arms and along the edges of the arm-openings are stitched elastic shoulder-straps e of loop shape. The elastic shoulder-straps are 55 placed over the shoulders and serve to support the waist a on the shoulders in such a manner that the shoulders can be freely moved without being inconvenienced by the tension of the waist. The elastic front- 60 straps of the waist a serve to support the bust, without discomfort, and permit in connection with the lacing-strings b^1 the close fitting of the waist body, while reducing at the same time the bust, which is the general 65 desire of stout women. The bust-supporter serves thereby two objects, namely, to give a comfortable fit for and obtain the reduction of the bust. As the bust-supporter is made of soft flexible and attractive material 70 and trimmed with lace, it serves also as a corset-cover, so as to dispense with this garment.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters 75

Patent:

A bust-supporter consisting of an unstiffened waist-like garment cut away at the upper part and provided at each side of the upper breast-portion with a recess having 80 unstiffened side-edges extending downwardly in the breast-portion from the upper edge of the garment, a plurality of transverse elastic straps extending across each recess and connecting the edges thereof, and elastic 85 shoulder-straps attached to the arm-openings of the garment.
