ABSORBENT FOR PERSPIRATION.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, Isadore Baskin, Joseph Hoffman, and Edward Master, citizens of the United States, residing at Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Composition of Matter to be Used in Shoes as an Absorbent for Perspiration and to Ease Tired Feet, of which the following is a specification.

Our composition consists of the following ingredients, combined in or about the proportions stated, viz.: zinc oxid, forty per cent.; burnt alum, thirty per cent.; spearmint leaves, five per cent.; linden leaves, ten per cent.; pulverized asbestos, ten per cent.;

violet leaves, five per cent. These ingredients are reduced to a powder and are then thoroughly mixed.

In using the above-named composition the

powder is dusted into the shoe once in from two to four weeks. The combined ingredients form a mixture that will absorb all perspiration and prevent resulting irritation, thereby giving the person using the 25 powder, ease and comfort.

We claim:

A composition consisting of zinc oxid, burnt alum, pulverized asbestos, powdered linden leaves, powdered spearmint leaves, 30 and powdered violet leaves substantially in the proportions specified.
