

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Samuel Treinis, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of the city of New York, borough of Brook-5 lyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Garment, of which the following is a full. clear, and exact specification.

The object of the invention is to provide
a new and improved garment for bathing,
athletic and other purposes, and provided
with an integral jockstrap, which can be
conveniently opened or closed and when
worn is practically concealed and not visible.

15 For the purpose mentioned use is made of
a suspensory band extending from the back
of the garment and having its free end detachably connected with the free ends of
straps or webbings attached to the rear of
the garment.

A practical embodiment of the invention is represented in the accompanying drawings forming a part of this specification, in which similar characters of reference indi-

Figure 1 is a perspective view of the garment as worn with a pair of trunks, parts of the latter being shown broken out; Fig. 2 is a cross section of the garment shown in Fig. 30 1; and Fig. 3 is a plan view of the suspen-

sory band shown in Figs. 1 and 2. As shown in the figures the suspensory. band H forms an extension of the back of the shirt I, and is narrow at the middle and 35 widens out toward both the back and front ends as plainly indicated in Fig. 3, the front portion forming an abdominal pad. The shirt I is provided at the front with an abdominal portion I' over which is passed the 40 front or abdominal portion of the suspensory band H, as plainly indicated in Figs. 1 and 2. Hooks J are attached to the corners of the free end of the abdominal portion of the suspensory band H, and the said 45 hooks J are adapted to be engaged by eyes or loops K, held on the adjustable ends of an elastic strap or web L, extending through reinforced slits N formed in the sides of the shirt I, and slidingly engaging a loop O

secured to the back waist line of the shirt 50 at the inside thereof. The several parts are so arranged that when the garment is worn the straps L extend upwardly and rearwardly over the hip portions of the wearer and pass from the outside through the slits N 55 to the inside of the garment, to engage the loop O at the back of the shirt I, thus holding the suspensory band H in proper supporting position, at the same time allowing for bodily movement without danger of 60 chafing the wearer at the crotch.

It is understood that when the garment I is worn, the lower portion thereof with the suspensory band H is inclosed in the trunks worn with the garment I, so as to completely 65 cover the said band.

It is expressly understood that I do not limit myself to the fastening devices J, K shown and described, or to the particular form of the garment I on which the sus-70 pensory band H is used, as the same may be varied without deviating from the spirit of my invention.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters 75 Patent:

A garment having a suspensory band extending from the rear end of the said garment and adapted to overlie the front abdominal portion of the garment, the said 80 band being narrow at the middle and widening out toward the back and front ends, an elastic strap having adjustable front ends, fastening devices detachably connecting the front ends of the strap to the corners of the 85 front end of the band, the said strap extending through reinforced slits formed in the sides of the garment, and a loop secured to the back waist line of the garment at the inside thereof and slidingly engaged by said 90 strap.
