My improved composition consists essentially of the following ingredients, viz:-

| 40% | _Oil free soap. |
|-----|------------------|
| 40% | Distilled water. |
| 18% | Flake graphite. |
| 2% | Turpentine. |

In compounding my polish, I employ soap which is preferably, but not absolutely, in cake form. This soap together with the water is heated over a slow burning fire until the soap is thoroughly dissolved or mixed with the water. The mass is then allowed to slowly cool, and during this cooling proc-. ess, the graphite is added and stirred into

I have disclosed a particular manner of 50 compounding my polish and also certain proportions of the ingredients employed by me, but I do not wish to limit myself to this exact manner of compounding, nor the specific proportions of the ingredients used as 55 changes may be made therein, without departing from the spirit and scope of the invention as claimed.

What I claim as new is:-

A polishing composition consisting of oil 60 free soap, distilled water, flake graphite and turpentine and these being combined in the proportions of forty per cent soap, forty per cent water, eighteen per cent graphite and two per cent turpentine.
