

Having thus described the invention, what

15 is claimed as new is:

1. A game appliance comprising a handle formed from wood or similar material thinned for a portion of its length and having its thinned portion looped back upon 20 itself with its terminal part resting against one side of the handle and thereby providing an open substantially elliptical head, and a thong secured about the handle and about the said terminal part.

2. A game appliance comprising a handle
