



EXHIBITOR FOR GOODS.

Application filed February 13, 1922. Serial No. 535,970.

To all whom it may concern:

5 have invented a new and useful Exhibitor slots 5, said slots 5 and 4 being adapted to 60 for Goods, of which the following is a specification.

My invention consists of a device for exhibiting goods and also presenting informa-10 tion concerning the price and material of the goods. In the present instance, the goods are hosiery, but to this I do not limit myself.

The invention is satisfactorily illustrated 15 in the accompanying drawing, but the important instrumentalities thereof may be varied, and so it is to be understood that the invention is not limited to the specific details shown and described, as long as they ²⁰ are within the spirit or scope of the claim.

> When the service of the device is not required, the head is removed from the side wings the latter are folded on the inner side of the front member with the head within the same forming a comparatively flat 70 bundle convenient for packing, transportation, storage and the like.

In the upper portion of the front member are the horizontally extending parallel slots 6 which form the cross bar 7. In the side wings 2 are parallel slots 13 forming the cross bars 14 from which may be suspended specimens of goods such as 15 which will thus be exhibited to the best advantage to the public whereby they may be inspected and examined as to quality and appearance, while the price and grade of goods may be conveniently read off at the same time from the front member.

Having thus described my invention what I claim as new and desire to secure by Let-

15 ters Patent, is:—
An exhibitor of the character stated con-

sisting of a front member, side wings hinged thereto adapted to be opened-out and folded, a display head, the latter being adapted to be supported on said side wings and retain 20 the latter in opened out position, means on said head and side wings for interlocking the same, means on said front member adapted to support a variable price list, means on said front member adapted to support a variable material list, and means on said side wings for supporting goods to be exhibited.
