

The invention having been set forth what

is claimed as new and useful is:-

The combination with the upper end of a fruit picker's sack, said sack having an open bottom closed by draw strings adapted to be tightened and hooked over hooks adjacent the upper end of the sack, a frame carried by the upper end of said sack, said frame being formed from wire and elongated, the inner side of said frame being bent to form upwardly extending hook receiving loops, U-shaped hooks adjacent the ends of the frame, said hooks having their arms extending downwardly and upwardly

and having eye connections with the ends of 15 the frame and U-shaped brace members extending inwardly from one of the upwardly extending arms of the hooks and having eye connections with the inner side of the frame.
