

This invention relates to certain new and useful improvements in buckles and has par-10 ticular reference to a buckle associated with a shoulder or suspender strap for use in connection with garments such as overalls.

The primary object of the invention resides in the provision of a buckle wherein 15 the several parts forming the same are constructed of heavy leather or fabric material with metallic clips connecting the sections thereof and embodying an improved clasp attachment in buckles of this character.

Referring more in detail to the accom- From the above detail description of the 100 45 panying drawing, it being noted that the device, it is believed that the construction main body portion of the buckle is constructed of heavy leather or other fibrous material, and preferably being associated with wearing apparel, such as overalls or the like, the same embodies a main intermediate body portion 1 substantially rectangular in plan view as illustrated, having a suspender strap receiving loop movably associated with one end thereof. The loop is of 55 rectangular formation embodying side bars 2 and inset side bars 2ª, the side bars 2ª be-

To all whom it may concern: ing connected at their lower ends by the Be it known that I, Joseph Pach, a citi- cross bar 3 while the upper ends thereof are with the upper side bars 2 that are connected at their outer ends by the upper cross bar 5. A metallic strap has the loop portion 6 thereof enclosing the lower cross bar 3 while the sides 7 of the strap are riveted 65 as at 8 to the opposite sides of the adjacent end of the main body portion 1 as clearly illustrated.

A locking clasp or tongue 9 is hingedly connected to the opposite end of the main 70 body portion 1 by a metallic hinge 10 having the opposed plate sections thereof respectively secured to the clasp 9 and the main body portion as shown in Fig. 3. When the clasp 9 is folded to a position ad- 75 With the above general objects in view jacent and overlying the main body portion 1, as illustrated in Figs. 1 and 2, the locking collar 11 freely slidable upon the main body portion is moved to a position overlying the arrangement of parts hereinafter more fully clasp as illustrated in Fig. 2 for retaining 80 the same in closed position. A suspender strap 12 attached to a portion of the garment G is adjustably connected to the cross bar 5 of the loop.

The keeper member associated with the Figure 2 is an edge elevational view of the buckle, includes a metallic rectangular frame 13 carried by a relatively soft leather Figure 3 is a perspective view of the looped member 14 that is secured to the garment G as shown in Figs. 1 and 4, the lock- 95 ing tongue or clasp 9 being inserted through Figure 4 is a perspective view showing the keeper member 13, and thereafter moved to the positions shown in Figs. 1 and 2 and so retained by the sliding locking collar 11.

What is claimed as news is:—

1. In a buckle of the type described, 110 wherein the same is constructed of relatively heavy leather, a main body portion substan-

tially rectangular in plan view, a retaining clasp hingedly connected to one end of the body portion, and a suspender strap attaching loop hingedly connected to the other end

5 of the body portion.

2. In a buckle of the type described, wherein the same is constructed of relatively heavy leather, a main body portion substantially rectangular in plan view, a retaining 10 clasp hingedly connected to one end of the body portion, a suspender strap attaching loop hingedly connected to the other end of the body portion, and means for retaining wherein the same is constructed of relatively 40 the clasp in its locked position adjacent the heavy leather, a main body portion substan-

15 main body portion. wherein the same is constructed of relatively heavy leather, a main body portion substantially rectangular in plan view, a retaining 20 clasp hingedly connected to one end of the mounted on the main body portion and assobody portion, a suspender strap attaching loop hingedly connected to the other end of the body portion, and a sliding collar freely mounted on the main body portion and asso-25 ciated with the clasp for retaining the same in its locked position adjacent and parallel to the main body portion.

In a buckle of the type described, wherein the same in constructed of relatively heavy leather, a main body portion substan- 30 tially rectangular in plan view, a retaining clasp hingedly connected to one end of the body portion, a suspender strap attaching loop hingedly connected to the other end of the body portion, means for retaining the 35 clasp in its locked position adjacent the main body portion, and a keeper member associated with the locking clasp of the buckle.

In a buckle of the type described, clasp hingedly connected to one end of the body portion, a suspender strap attaching loop hingedly connected to the other end of 45 the body portion, a sliding collar freely ciated with the clasp for retaining the same in its locked position adjacent and parallel to the main body portion, and a keeper mem- 50 ber associated with the locking clasp of the buckle.
