

The rear side of the carton is provided with an inverted Ushaped slit 16 which forms an easel leg brace 17, and which brace is preferably provided with a recess 18 in its free end whereby after 85 the easel leg 13 is bent outwardly to a right angular position and the brace 17 is bent outwardly to a right angular position on the horizontal line 19, said recess 18 will receive the edge 20 within the easel leg 13, 90 and will hold said leg 13 in extended position. It will be noted that the brace member 17 extends on both sides of the fold 14 and preferably substantially the same distance, consequently the notch 18 will be in proper 98 position for holding the easel leg 13 at a right angle to the back 1.
