



from a wash cloth is comparatively simple and can be performed expeditiously in a minimum of time and with little effort 20 when soiled from use, the neck string may be removed, the tacking at the back of the head cut and the parts unfolded to permit cleansing by washing or otherwise after which the cloth may be refolded and tacked and a new neck string used or the cloth may then be used as a wash cloth.

What I claim is: 1. A bunny wash cloth comprising a onepiece rectangular cloth having rounded corners with the characters of a rabbit's face indicated on the upper portion thereof, the so said upper portion of said cloth being folded into the form of a rabbit's head with the two forming the neck and the lower side por- cape. tions of said cloth being folded over upon the body portion to secure a cape effect.

An article of the character described, comprising a one-piece rectangular cloth 95 with an embroidered edge and rounded corners having its upper portion provided with the features of a rabbit indicated thereon and folded to simulate the head of a rabbit, the two upper corners thereof being each 100 gathered together to form an ear and a cord for forming a neck; the side portions of said cloth being folded over upon the body portion thereof to simulate a cape.
