

In accomplishing these and other objects 40 of the invention, I have provided improved details of structure, the preferred forms of which are illustrated in the accompanying drawing, wherein:

Fig. 1 is a perspective view from the rear of a child wearing a garment constructed in the elastic strip to the body and portion 6 of 95 accordance with my invention.

Fig. 2 is a front view of the same.

Fig. 3 is an enlarged fragmentary detail perspective view of the garment, illustrating ⁵⁰ a blouse flap in open position, a bloomer and a line of stitching 14 located below the 100

The bloomers may consist of any number of pieces of material and are preferably formed to provide vertical edges at the up-My invention therefore has for its princi- per ends of the bloomer members. seam positions. Mounted in the recess between the body of 80 of forming the back there is an elastic strip 9 shorter than the hem 5 and having an upper edge adjacent the fold edge of the hem, and a lower edge adjacent the raw edge there- 85 of, the ends of the strip being spaced slightly from the ends of the back hem 5 to leave spacing sections 10. A tape 11 having inwardly folded edges is mounted on the inwardly presented face of the hem portion 5 90 having an upper edge spaced from the fold edge of the hem and projecting below the lower edge of the hem portion 5. A line of stitching 12 adjacent the fold edge attaches the back member. Lines of stitching 13 and 15 extend through the folded portions of the tape, portion 6, elastic strip and body of the back member to secure the same together,

lower edge of the elastic strip and portion 6 secures the lower edge portion of the tape to the body of the back bloomer member.

The stitches above referred to are applied 5 while the elastic strip is tensioned and the term "bloomers". hem 5 is preferably made longer than the width of the back section of the blouse later described, whereby the stitched portions of the hem 5 and tape and adjacent portions of 10 the back member of the bloomers, are wrinkled when the strip is relaxed.

and attached thereto by lines of stitching 18, seams. and vertical edge portions underlying the outer faces of the offset end portions 7' of the hem 5 and attached thereto by lines of stitch-

ing 19.The blouse further includes a back member 20 having materially greater length than the c25 front member to form downwardly extending vertical edges 21 and lying inside the front member and bloomers. The vertical edge portions 21 are attached to the bloomers and front waist member respectively by downwardly continued portions of the stitches 8 and the lines of stitching 19, and nations of said lines of stitching 19, thus defining side seam positions in the bloomers 35 and forming side seams 19' in the blouse.

The back member of the blouse is thus attached only at vertical edges on median lines on the sides of the garment, whereby a flap 22 is formed adapted to be freely movable 540 into and out of the bloomers, and having a lower horizontal edge normally parallel with the plane of the waist line.

The garment above described thus comprises a unit including a blouse and bloomers. 45 having a front member supported by the blouse when worn, the relatively short elastic portion at the bloomer waist line, engaging the body of the wearer, serving to retain the back member of the bloomers in proper align-50 ment with the waist line of the front member but having relatively small constricting effect on the hody.

The flap portion of the blouse is normally retained in depending position to cover the 55 buttocks of the wearer, both because of the anchoring function of the downwardly extending vertical edge portions attached to the bloomers, and because of the binding effect of the elastic waist element.

The wearer may easily withdraw the flap portion of the blouse from the bloomers, and stretch the elastic element for letting down the back member, and may then restore the back member and flap to normal position.

A garment comprising front and back bloomer sections having substantially aligned 85 upper edges provided with hems, stitching connecting said hems to form side seams, an elastic strip in the hem of the back bloomer section, a front blouse section having a lower edge attached to the hem of the 90 bloomer front section, a back blouse section including an upper portion having vertical side edges located substantially in alignment with said side seams and connected to the front blouse section, a lower portion having 95 vertical side edges extending a substantial to the front waist member by upward contin- distance along the bloomers in alignment with said side seams, and means securing said side edges of the lower portion of the back blouse section to the bloomers.

3. A garment including a front portion having waist and pant sections, a back pant section united with the front pant section to form a pant portion of the garment and having a free upper edge provided with a 105 hem, an elastic strip in said hem, means at the waist line of said front portion connected with said hem to form a continuous waist band around the garment, a back waist section including a lower end portion depending 110 into the back pant section, and having vertical edges registering substantially with the median side lines of the pant portion of the garment, and means securing said vertical edges of the depending portion of the back 115 waist section to the pant portion of the garment.
