

What I claim is: 1. An article of the class described comprising a necktie of the four-in-hand type having a large and a small end, an aperture provided in the small end near its termination, and a single loop of elastic cord sewed to the back of the large end, said loop being of sufficient length to enable it to be passed through the aperture in the small end to engage about a shirt button when the necktie is being worn.

2. An article of the class described comprising a necktie having two tying ends, a single relatively long elastic cord loop attached to one of said ends, and an aperture formed in the other end through which the loop is passed to engage a shirt button when

the necktie is being worn.

3. An article of the class described comprising a necktie having a pair of tying ends, one of which comprises an inner end and the other an outer end when the necktie is in its tied condition, a single relatively lengthy elastic cord loop attached to the back of the outer tying end, an opening formed in the inner tying end, the loop being of sufficient length to permit it to be either passed through the opening to engage a shirt button or else permit the inner tying end of the tie to be passed through it before it engages the shirt button.

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
