DESIGN FOR A CARPET-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **1,535**, dated February 11, 1862.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY G. THOMPSON, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented or produced a new and original Design for a Pattern to be Inwrought into Three-Ply Ingrain and other Carpeting, in colors similar to those painted on the drawing accompanying this specification or in other colors substituted in the place of those painted on the drawing herewith; and I do hereby declare that the drawing accompanying this specification does give and convey to any one skilled in the art of carpet-weaving a more defined and thorough description of the nature of my invention than it is in the

power of language otherwise to convey, and is sufficient to enable any one skilled in the art of carpet-weaving to use my invention.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The configuration of the design hereunto annexed, when made by being inwrought into three-ply ingrain or other carpeting in the form similar to the drawing accompanying this specification.
