

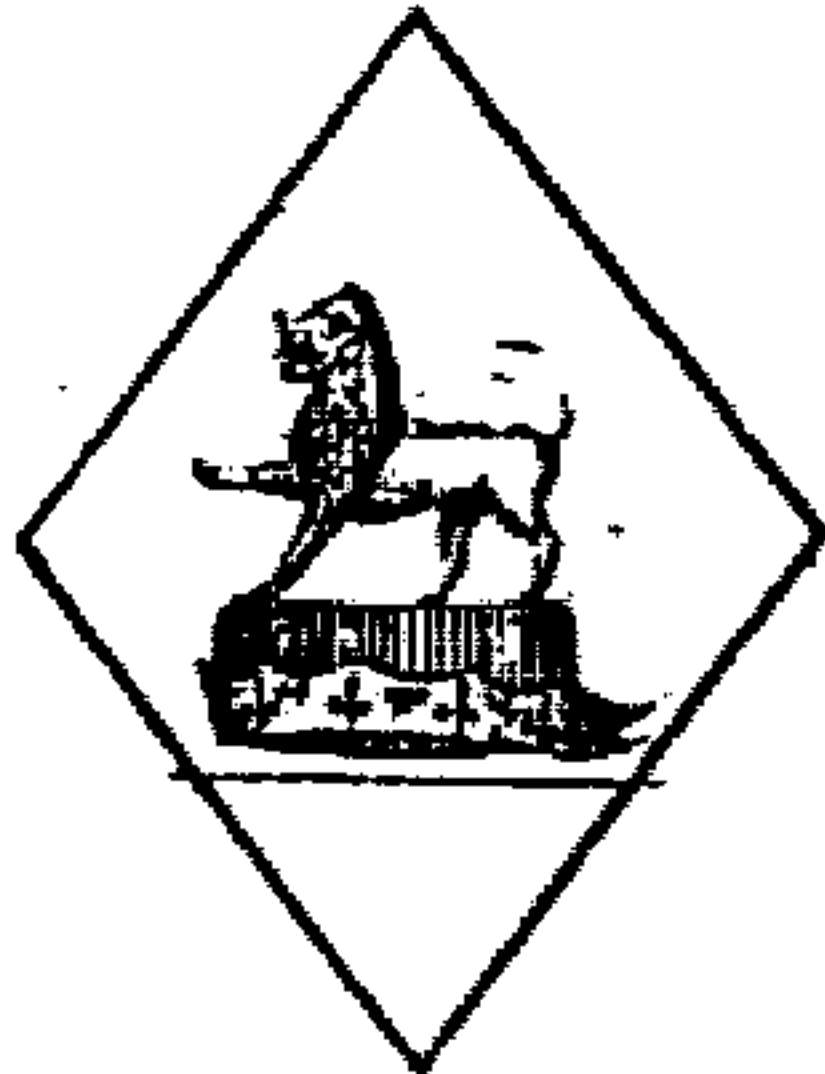

Design for a Trade Mark.

The schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that J. E. Correll, of Port-

land, in the County of Cumberland and State of Maine, have originated and invented a new design for a Trade Mark, of which the following is a full, clear and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings or specimens, making part of these specifications, in which -

Fig. No. 1 represents an example of my design as colored.

Fig. No. 2 the same with colors.

The object of my invention is to produce a trade mark, to be used by me to stamp certain articles of manufacture by me made, or the receptacles in which they are contained.

My invention consists of certain figures or designs, represented at figs. 1 and 2 in the accompanying drawings and hereinafter enumerated and described, included within lines so drawn as to form a diamond or rhombus. The outer one of these lines is heavier and broader than the inner. Within the lines thus described and drawn are the figures of a cap and a lion. Around the lower edge of the cap there is represented a band in width about one half the height of the cap, curved at the upper edge and shaded with black. Upon the band are represented four tongues with leaves, four with three and one with two of said leaves. The ends of the

bands are not represented to meet around the cap but project separately and are brought to points behind the same. The cap thus described is surmounted with the figure of a lion three of whose feet are resting upon the cap, the fourth is held in a horizontal position.

The design may be used with colors as in fig. 2, or without as in fig. 1.

When it is desirable to be used with colors, I color the figure of the lion a light brown, the cap vermilion and the band a light yellow.

What I claim as my invention and desire to secure by Letters Patent is—

The design for a trade mark herein set forth and described.
