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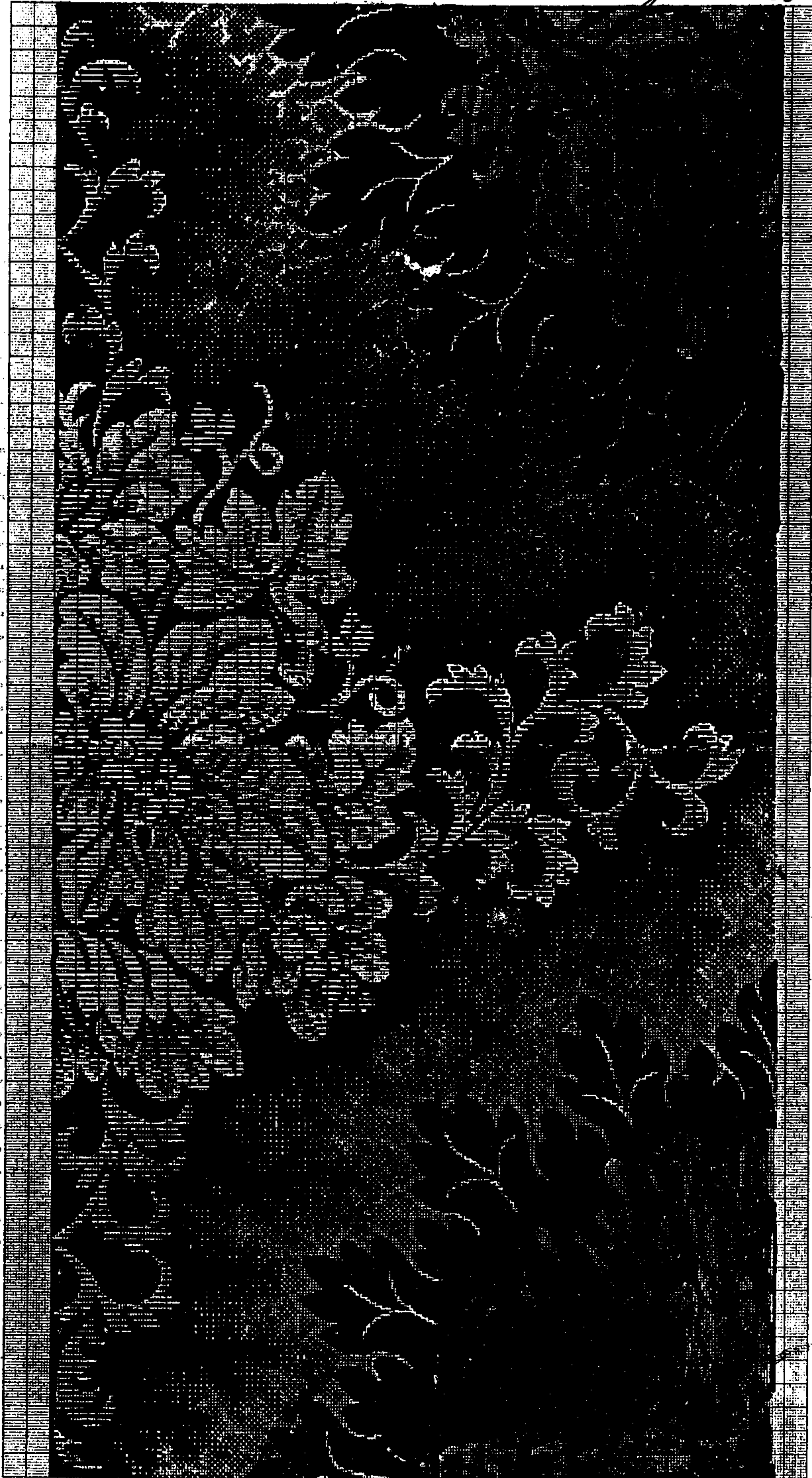

Design for a Carpet Pattern.

The schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Henry G. Thompson, of the City, County and State of New York, have invented or produced a new and original Design for a Pattern to be inwrought into Two-ply, Ingrain and other Carpeting, in colors similar to those painted on the drawings accompanying this Specification, or in other colors substituted in the place of those painted on the drawings herewith; and I do hereby declare that the drawings accompanying this Specification, do give and convey to any one skilled in the Art of Carpet-weaving a more defined and thorough description of the nature of my invention than it is in the power of language otherwise to convey, and is sufficient to enable anyone skilled in the art of carpet weaving to use my invention.

What I claim as my invention and desire to secure by Letters Patent is: -
