DESIGN FOR A SHAWL-BORDER.

Specification forming part of Design No. **2,491**, dated October 9, 1866.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MORRIS M. PEYSER, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new ornamental Design for a Shawl-Border; and I do hereby declare the same to be fully represented in the accompanying drawing or photographic exhibit of it, which denotes a portion of a knit shawl made with such a border.

This border is composed of a mottled ground or wreath of flowers and leaves and two party-colored edgings, the whole being as represented in the drawing, in which the ground is shown at A, the wreath at B, and the two edgings at C C'.

This design I term "No. 1,500, Flora," in order to distinguish it from others I have on sale.

The wreath is composed of a series of leaves and a series of flowers termed "heart's-ease," they being arranged so that there may be a flower between each two of the leaves.
