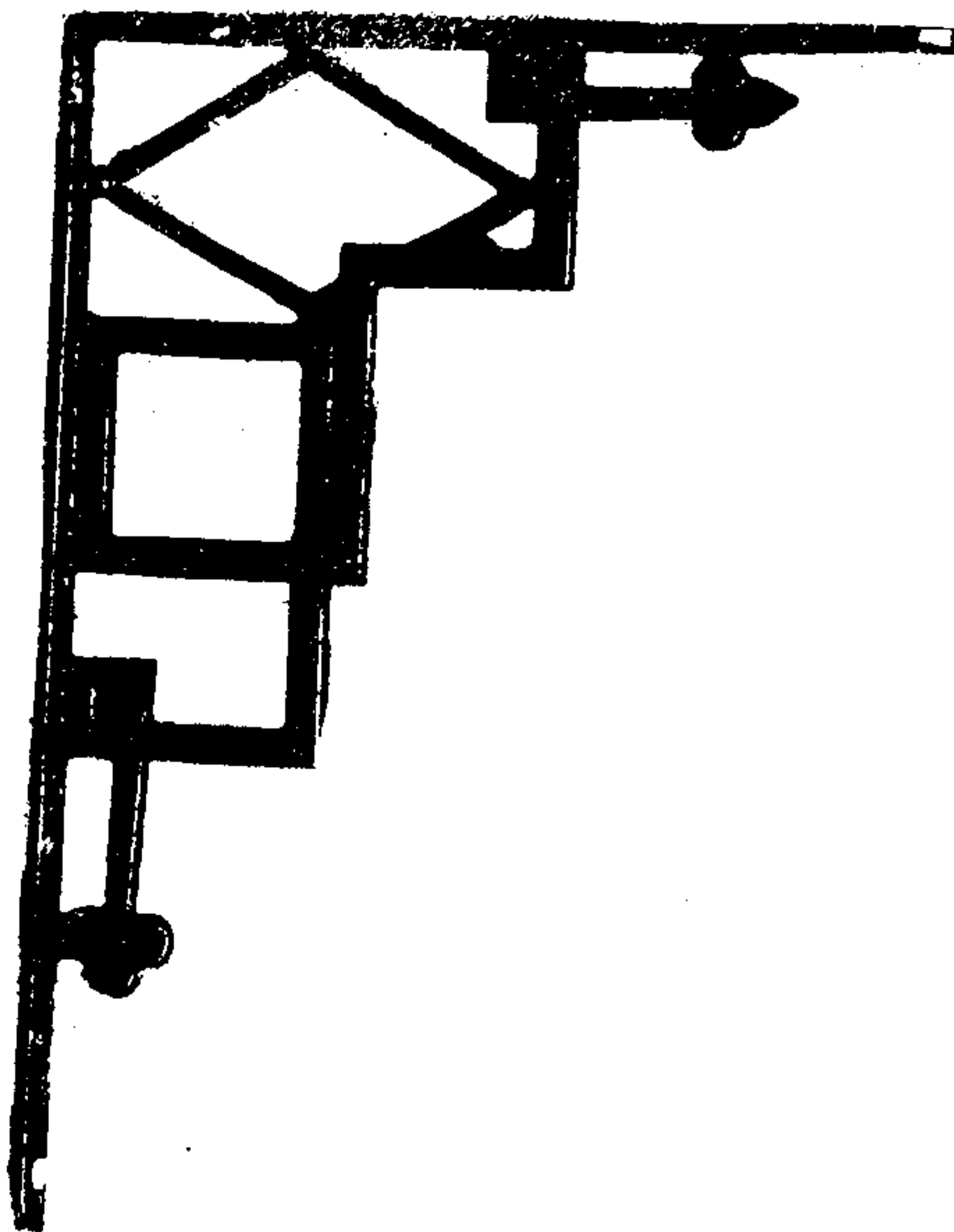

DESIGN FOR A SHELF-BRACKET.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM GORMAN, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven, and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Shelf-Bracket; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawing, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawing constitutes part of this specification, and represents a side view.

This invention relates to a design for a shelf-bracket, and consists of two arms, at right angles to each other, supported, one from the other, by a tracery in the form

of a Grecian-key pattern, having an open space at the inner angle of the two arms, filled with a diamond-shaped figure.

Having fully described my invention,

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design, herein described and illustrated, for a shelf-bracket.
