DESIGN FOR A GROUP OF STATUARY.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John Rogers, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented or produced a new and original Design for a Group of Statuary; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description of the same.

The group is called "Rip Van Winkle at home," and consists of three figures: Rip is in the center, half-seated on the rail of a fence; his hands are clasped over his right knee, and that foot rests on his left knee.

He is watching a little boy at his side, who is trying to lift his gun and take aim, while a little girl on

his right side has put his hat on and is pulling his hair to attract his attention, as fully shown in the accompanying drawing.

Having thus described my invention,

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a group of statuary, as herein shown and described.
