

ALEXANDER BECK, OF PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA.

DESIGN FOR A CARPET-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 5,380, dated November 28, 1871.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALEXANDER BECK, of Philadelphia, county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented or produced a Design for a Carpet-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A represents the body of the carpet, and B the border, between which intervenes a space, x, of appropriate width. The body A is composed of two sets of figures, a and a', of a character too clearly shown on the drawing to need description, these figures being alternated and arranged in respect to each other as illustrated. The border B is composed of two stripes, b and b'. The stripe b consists of two narrow scalloped ribs inclosing the foliated ornaments shown,

and the stripe b', which is also of a scalloped character, is arranged between the edging and the stripe b, and is considerably narrower than the latter.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—1. The design for the body A of the carpet,

substantially as shown and described.

2. The design for the border B, substantially as described and illustrated.

3. The design for a carpet-pattern, in which the body A and border B are combined.
