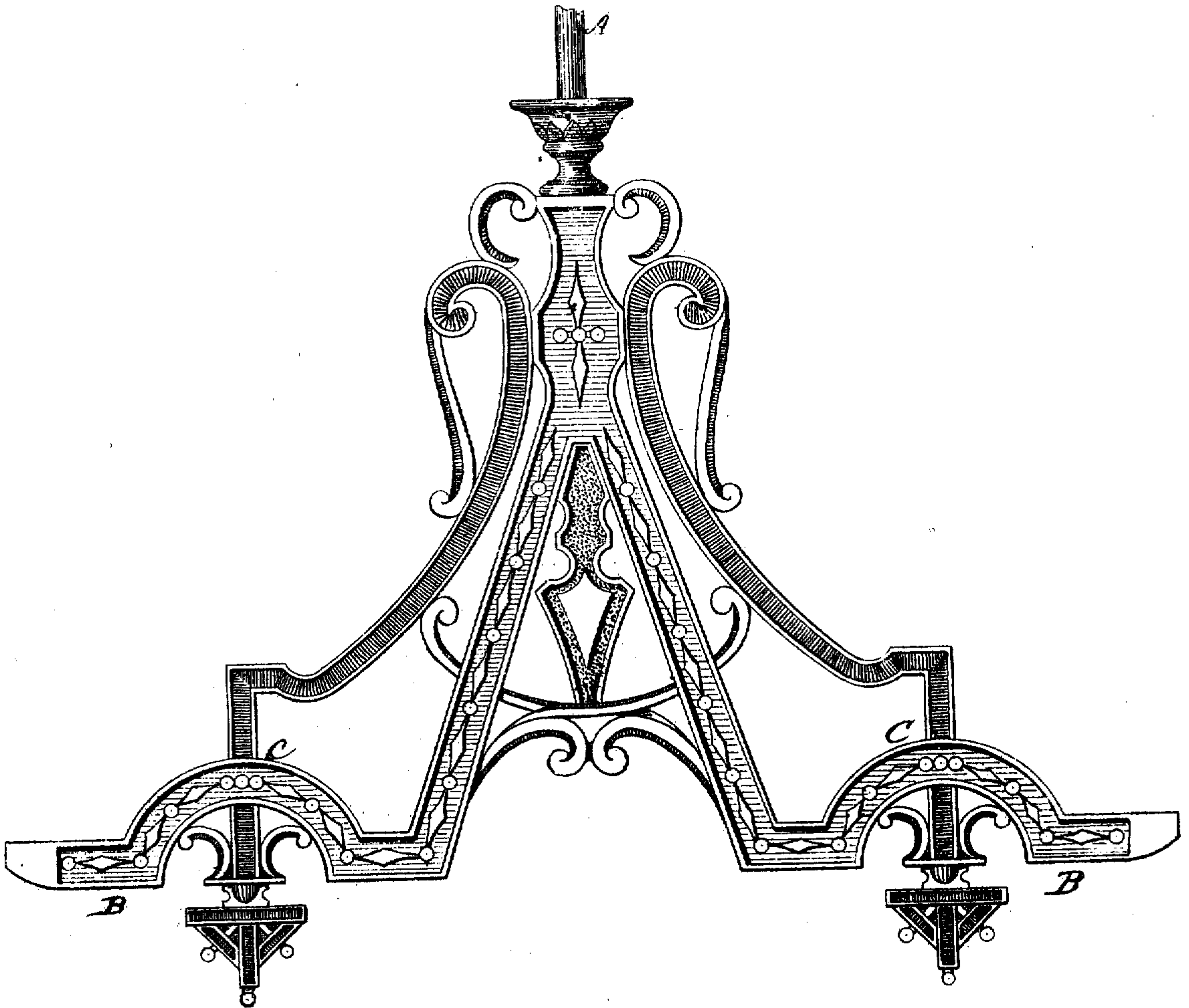

## DESIGN FOR CHANDELIER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 5,732, dated March 26, 1872.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, FREDERICK R. SEIDENSTICKER, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Chandelier; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawing and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawing constitutes part of this specification and represents a side view.

This invention relates to a design for that class of chandeliers designed to suspend or support kerosene or similar lamps, the same design being applicable to gas-chandeliers; and it consists in the peculiar configuration of the supporting-arms, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

From the pendant or tube A the arms extend down, separating in two parts to the right and left in a straight line, diverging and terminating at their lower extremity in parallel arms B B, a portion of which arms is of semi-circular form, C; and upon their extremities the burners are placed. Interwoven with these arms is combined tracery, in the form shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim as my invention—

The design for chandelier, as herein described and shown in the accompanying illustration.
