

DESIGN FOR A CAMPAIGN-BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 6,001, dated July 16, 1872.

Specification describing a Design for a Campaign-Badge, invented by G. C. THOMAS, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

It consists of a hat struck up from thin metal, to which is affixed a pin or an eye, by which it can be attached to the clothing or suspended from a chain.

Figure 1 is a top view. Fig. 2 is a sectional view through *x x*, Fig. 1.

A is a hat, formed from thin sheet metal. B is a pin, soldered into A at C. Instead of the pin an eye may be substituted.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a badge, constructed as and for the purpose substantially as specified.
