DESIGN FOR SAD-IRON HANDLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 6,874, dated September 9, 1873; application filed August 2, 1873.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH HARGRAVE, of Cincinnati, in the county of Hamilton and State of Ohio, have invented a Design for a Sad-Iron Handle, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The first part of the invention relates to the ornamentation of the bends of the handle. The second part of the invention relates to the ornamentation of the grasp or handle proper. The design consists of two dolphins of antique or conventional pattern, whose heads and bodies form the bends B B', and whose tails unite to form the grasp or handle proper A.

The shape of the sad C forms no part of this invention.

The following is claimed as new:

1. The design of the bends B B', consisting of two dolphins, substantially as represented.
2. The design of the combined bends B B' and grasp or handle proper A, the same consisting of two dolphins whose tails unite to form the grasp, substantially as shown and described.
