

## DESIGN FOR CHANDELIER.

Specification forming part of Design No. **7,576**, dated July 21, 1874; application filed June 3, 1874.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

### CASE B.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, FREDERICK R. SEIDENSTICKER, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Chandelier; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying illustration and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said illustration constitutes part of this specification, and represents a perspective view.

This invention relates to a design for the arm of chandeliers; and consists in the configuration of the arm, as shown.

The upper end A of the arm is semicircular, with scalloped edge. From this the arms B run down, curved outward, and gradually

increasing in depth to the cock C; thence turned upward, terminating in a scroll-shaped end, D, where the lamp rests. Upon the upper side of the arm is a bar, E, supported a short distance from the arm, its upper and lower end spear-shaped. Below this, on the under side, is a fan-shaped ornament, F, all as shown.

I claim as my invention—

The design for chandelier-arm consisting of the semicircular tip A, from which the arm B curves downward and outward, and up to the lamp-rest D, with the bar E upon the outside, and ornament F below, as shown and described.
