

DESIGN FOR BRACKETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 7,579, dated July 21, 1874; application filed June 13, 1874.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, ADOLPH WUNDER and JOSEPH B. SARGENT, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Bracket; and we do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a side view.

This invention relates to a design for castmetal bracket; and consists in the configuration of the brace or filling, as shown in the accompanying illustration, and hereinafter described.

The usual upright and horizontal pieces or arms are used. At the angle is an octagonal

figure filled with radial bars. This constitutes the peculiar characteristic of this design. Below and forward of this octagonal figure an open tracery of scroll-work completes the brace, the said two sections of tracery connected by the said octagonal figure.

We claim as our invention-

The design for bracket, consisting of the octagonal figure at the angle combined with tracery, extending down and forward from said figure to complete the brace, as herein described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
