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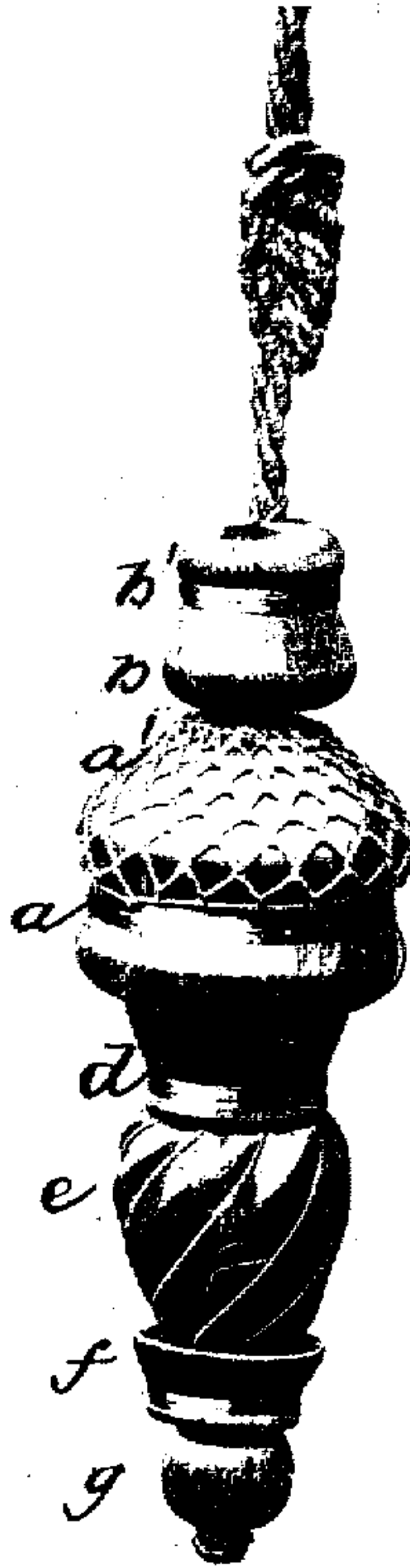

DESIGN FOR TASSEL-DROPS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 7,713, dated August 25, 1874; application filed August 10, 1874.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

CASE C.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ROBERT K. SLAUGHTER, of Brooklyn, Kings county, New York, have invented a Design for a Tassel-Drop, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The main portion *a* of the design is in the shape of an acorn, whose oval part is shortened or cut off, while the cup part is in imitation of the rough natural surface covered with a netting, *a'*. An upper or crown piece, *b*, of rounded-off conical shape, with circumferential band or strip *b'*, is arranged above part *a*, and a similarly-shaped piece, *d*, with band *d'*, arranged in reversed position below the same. A diagonally-fluted and striped or trimmed pear-shaped part, *e*, is placed below interme-

diating part *d*, and the design completed by the tapering conical part *f*, and the spherical lowermost piece *g*. All the parts are strung on a central connecting-cord in the usual manner, and finished in suitable material and appropriate colors to form the peculiar configuration and ornamentation shown.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a tassel-drop, formed of the shortened acorn-shaped main piece *a a'*, the conical crown-piece *b*, the fluted and trimmed pear-shaped piece *e*, conical piece *f*, and spherical point or bottom part *g*, as shown and described.
