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

DESIGN FOR HATS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,598, dated October 24, 1876; application filed September 18, 1876.

[Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Alonzo D. Foster, of the city of Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have originated and designed for manufacture a New Style or Pattern for a Hat, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustra-

tion, to which reference is made.

a represents the rim of the hat; a', the folded corners; b, the crown and c the cut corner. This hat is mainly to be used for campaign purposes, and for this use the crown is made of oil-cloth, in the form shown. The rim is then stitched flat and turned up, and the corners a' are stitched together, as shown, and the crown having the cut c is left to project without stitching, leaving the hat elastic or

somewhat variable in size. The hat is then mounted with a feather, plume, or other device, d.

I am aware that three-cornered hats are not

new, and I do not claim them.

The distinctive character of my design is found in the stitched corners a', and in bringing the rim or brim, when turned, on a line with the top of the crown, or near such line.

Suitable border linings or ornaments are to

be applied.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a campaign hat, composed of stitched and cut corners, with rim and crown tops nearly on a line, substantially as described.
