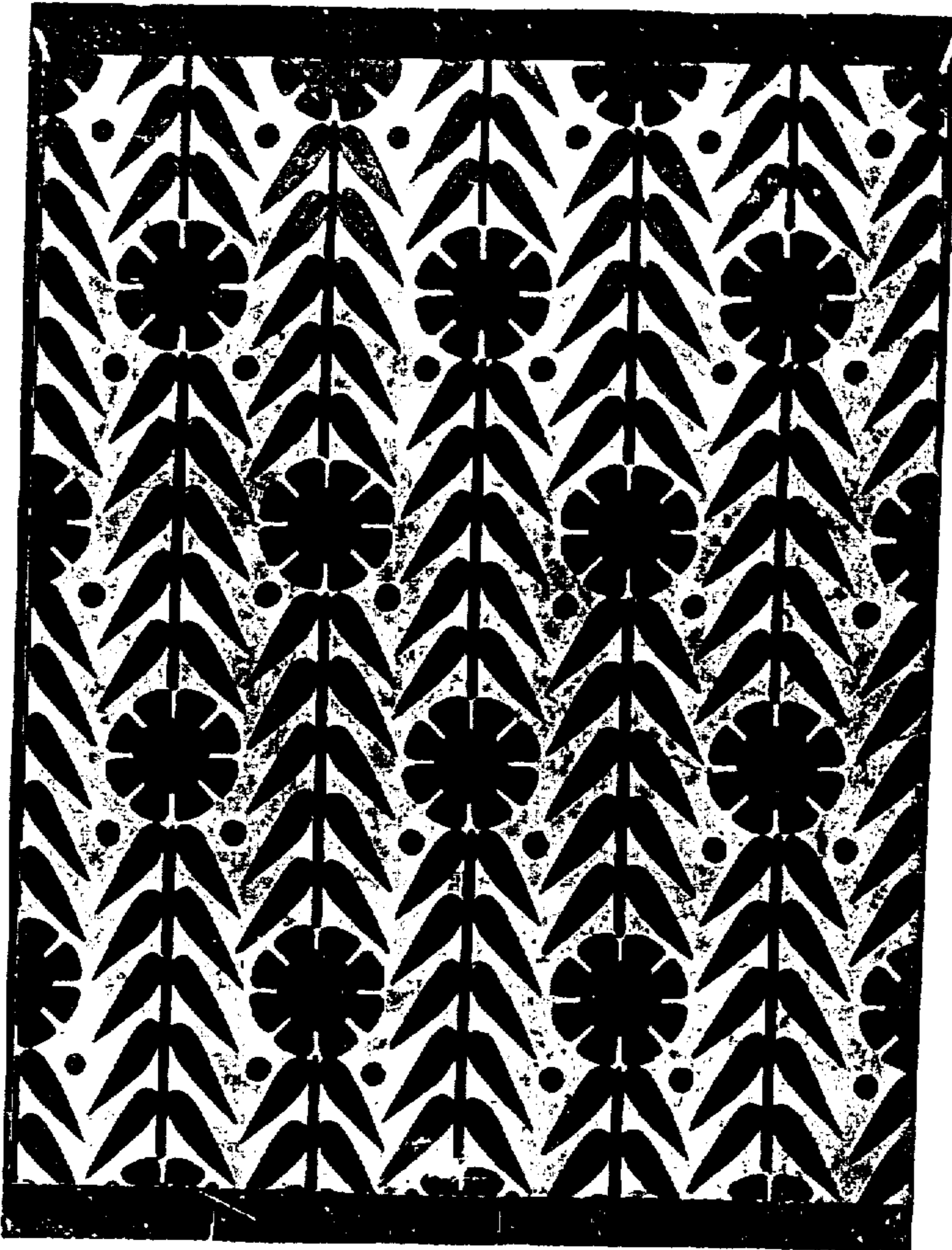

DESIGN FOR WALL-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,981**, dated May 15, 1877; application filed March 17, 1877.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHRISTOPHER DRESSER, of London, England, have originated and designed a Pattern for Wall and other Papers, of which I hereby declare the following to be a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My design consists, substantially, of a system of parallel rows of fern-stems, A, divided in the direction of the length by geometric rosettes B, breaking space with each other, so as to form diagonal lines of the latter.

What I claim as my invention, and desire

to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The design for a wall-paper, composed of a system of parallel rows of fern-stems, A, interspaced with rosettes B, substantially as shown and described.
