

## DESIGN FOR WALL-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,983, dated May 15, 1877; application filed March 17, 1877.

[Term of Patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Christopher Dresser, of London, England, have originated and designed a Pattern for Wall and other Papers, of which I hereby declare the following to be a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My invention consists of a design for a frieze for wall-papers, and is composed of a central portion. A, upon which is embodied a scroll, B, of grotesque ivy-leaves, the spaces of the background being filled up by leaf tracery C, and of borders D D at top and bottom, the latter being decorated with dashes and circles.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The design for a wall-paper, composed of the central portion A, provided with the scroll B of ivy-leaves, and of the borders D D, substantially as shown and described.
