DESIGN FOR BUTTONS, STUDS, AND OTHER JEWELRY.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,403**, dated January 15, 1878; application filed December 10, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, JAMES W. MILLER and ISAAC M. MILLER, of Newark, county of Essex, State of New Jersey, have originated a useful Design for Sleeve - Buttons, Studs, Locketts, Medallions, Charms, Pins, and Ear-Rings, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, forming part of this specification.

A represents a button, square in form. B represents a raised circle placed on the top of the button A. On the corners of the button A, and contiguous in position to the raised circle B, are placed four ornaments, *c c c c*. At *x x x x x x x x* are placed round posts, between which and the ornaments *c c c c* are placed twisted wires *z z z z*. Around the sides, at the base of the button A, is placed a shotted edge or border, D, and just above the

shotted edge D is placed a line of twisted wire, M.

The raised circle B, ornaments *c c c c*, and the round posts *x x x x x x x x* are lapped, thus forming a striking contrast to the colored or "dead finish" of the remaining parts of the button A.

Our claim is—

The design for sleeve - buttons and other jewelry composed of the raised lapped circle B, fancy lapped ornaments *c c c c*, the posts *x x x x x x x x*, shotted edge D, and twisted wires M and *z z z z*, in shape and position substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying photographic illustrations.
