

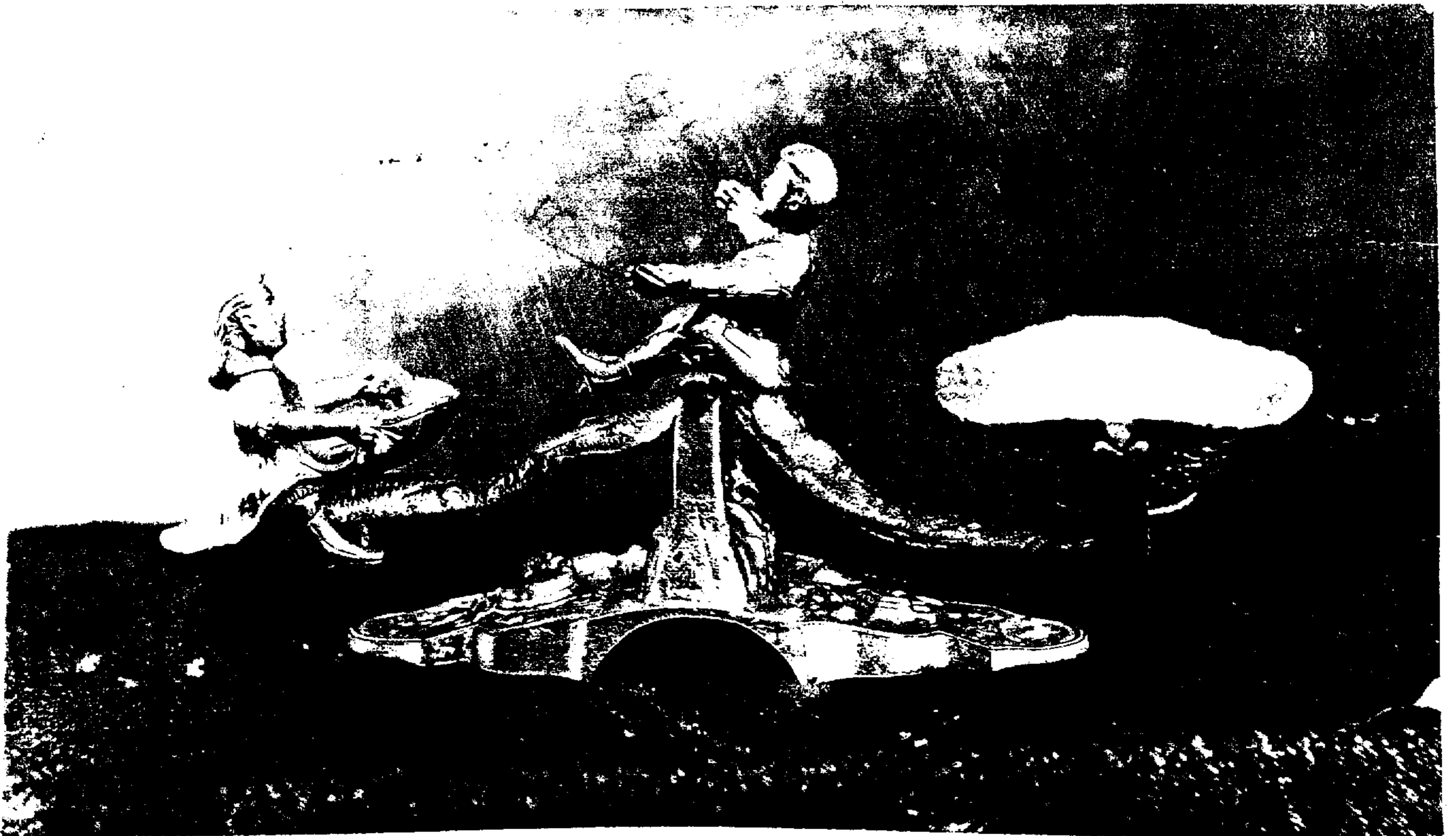

DESIGN FOR TOY SCALES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,141**, dated April 8, 1879; application filed March 12, 1879.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN GÉRARD, of Trenton, New Jersey, have produced a new and original Design for a Toy Scale, of which the following is a specification.

My design for a toy scale is fully shown in the accompanying fac-simile.

The essential feature of the design consists in the representation of two children playing at see-saw. The beam of the scale is made in imitation of a log balanced in the center on suitable supports rising from the base.

On one end of the beam is swung a basket, which serves as a tray of the scale, and on the other end of the beam is seated the figure of a little girl, whose extended apron forms a receptacle for the weights. Seated on the center of the beam, above the pivot, is the figure of a little boy.

Without limiting myself to any particular design for the base of the scale, or for the details of the ornamentation of the different parts,

I claim—

The design for a toy scale, said design consisting in the representation of two children playing at see-saw, all substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying drawing.
