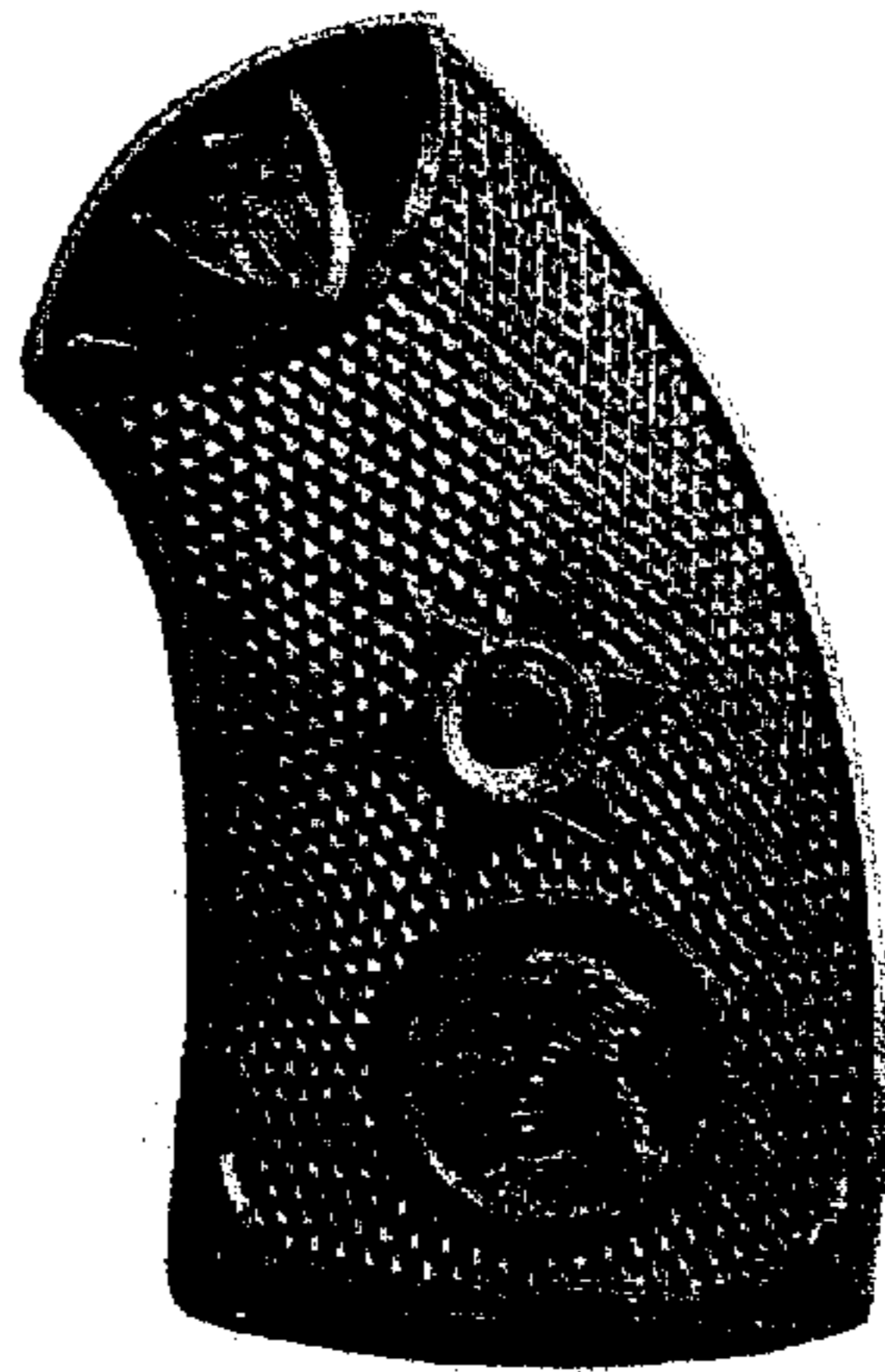
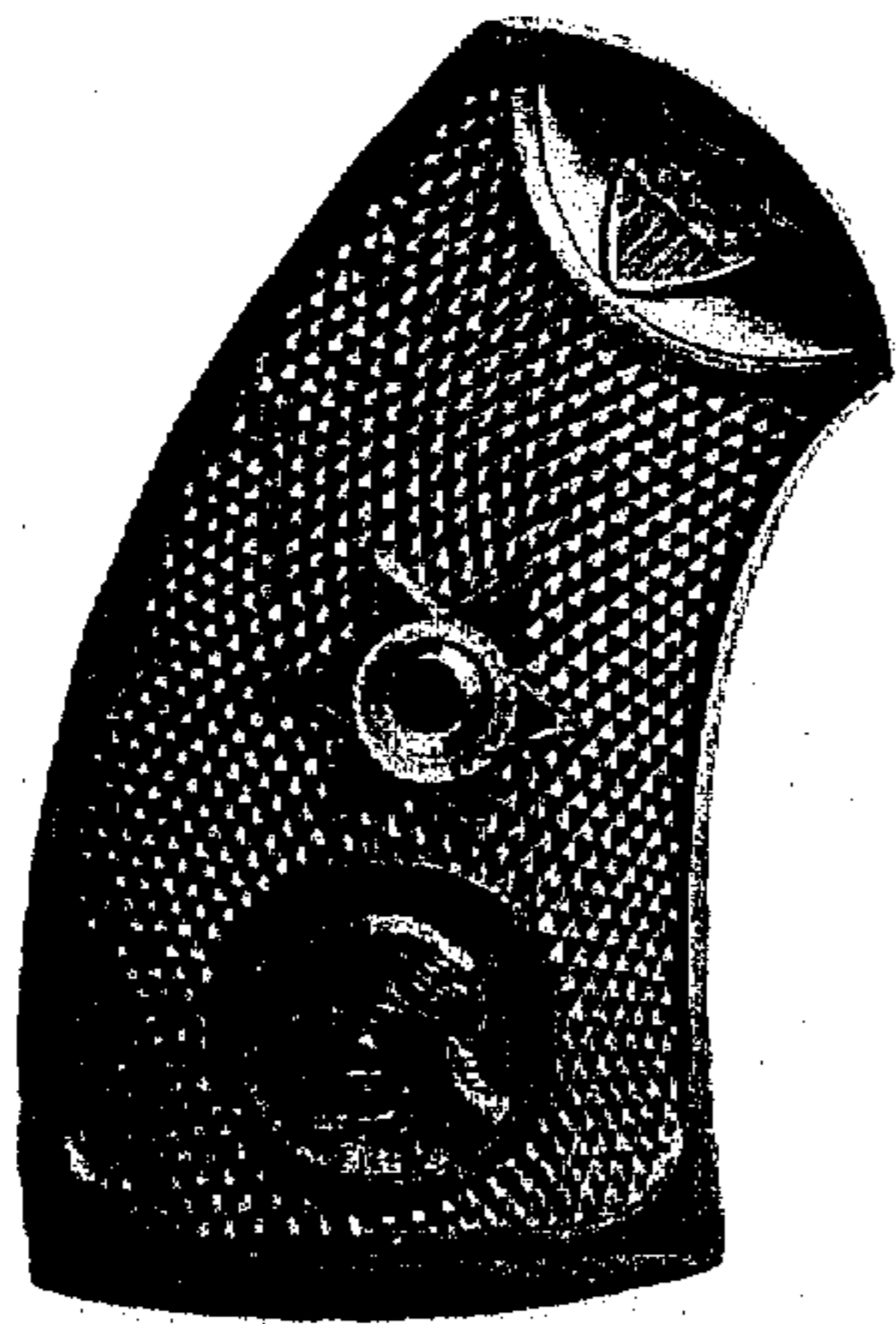
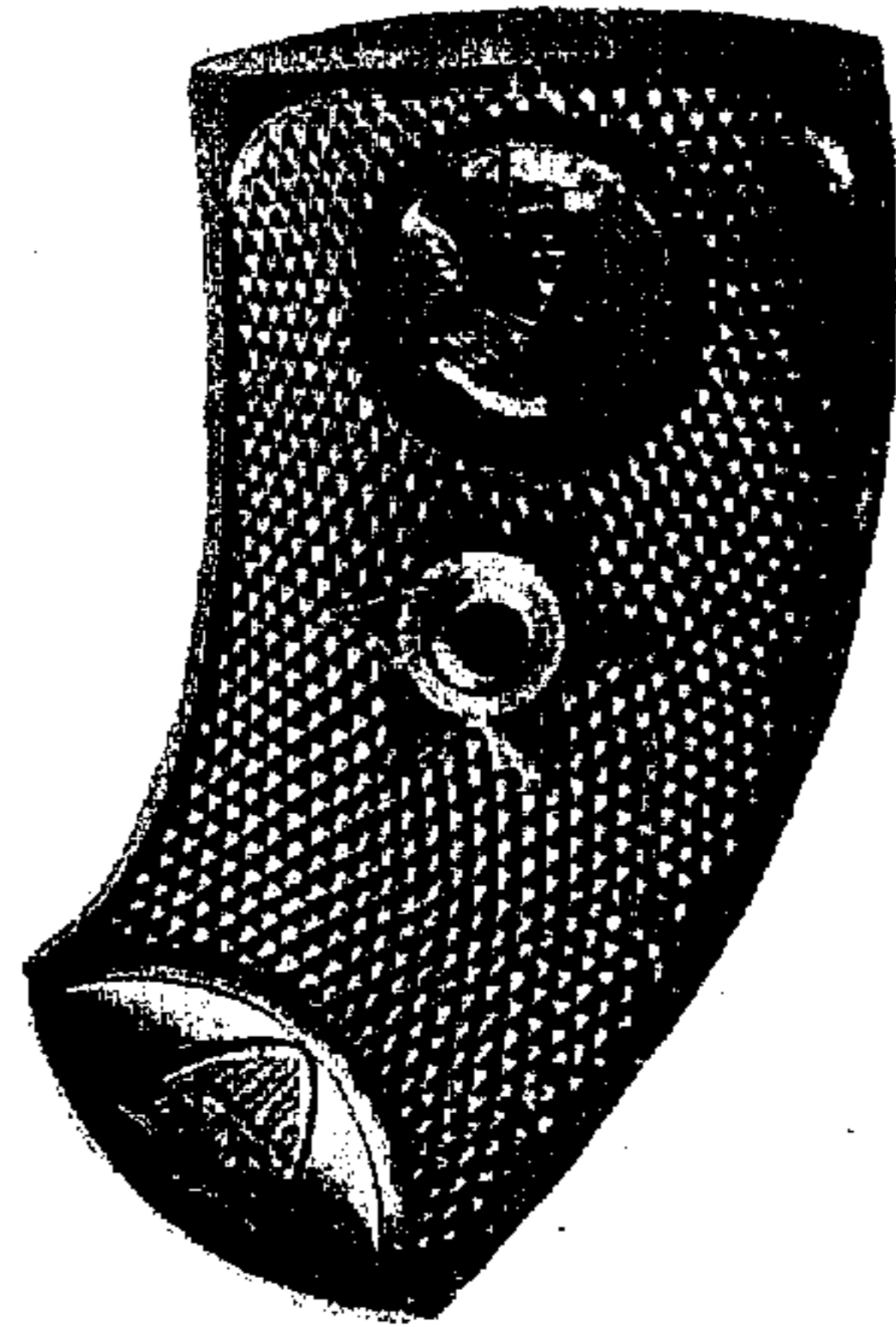
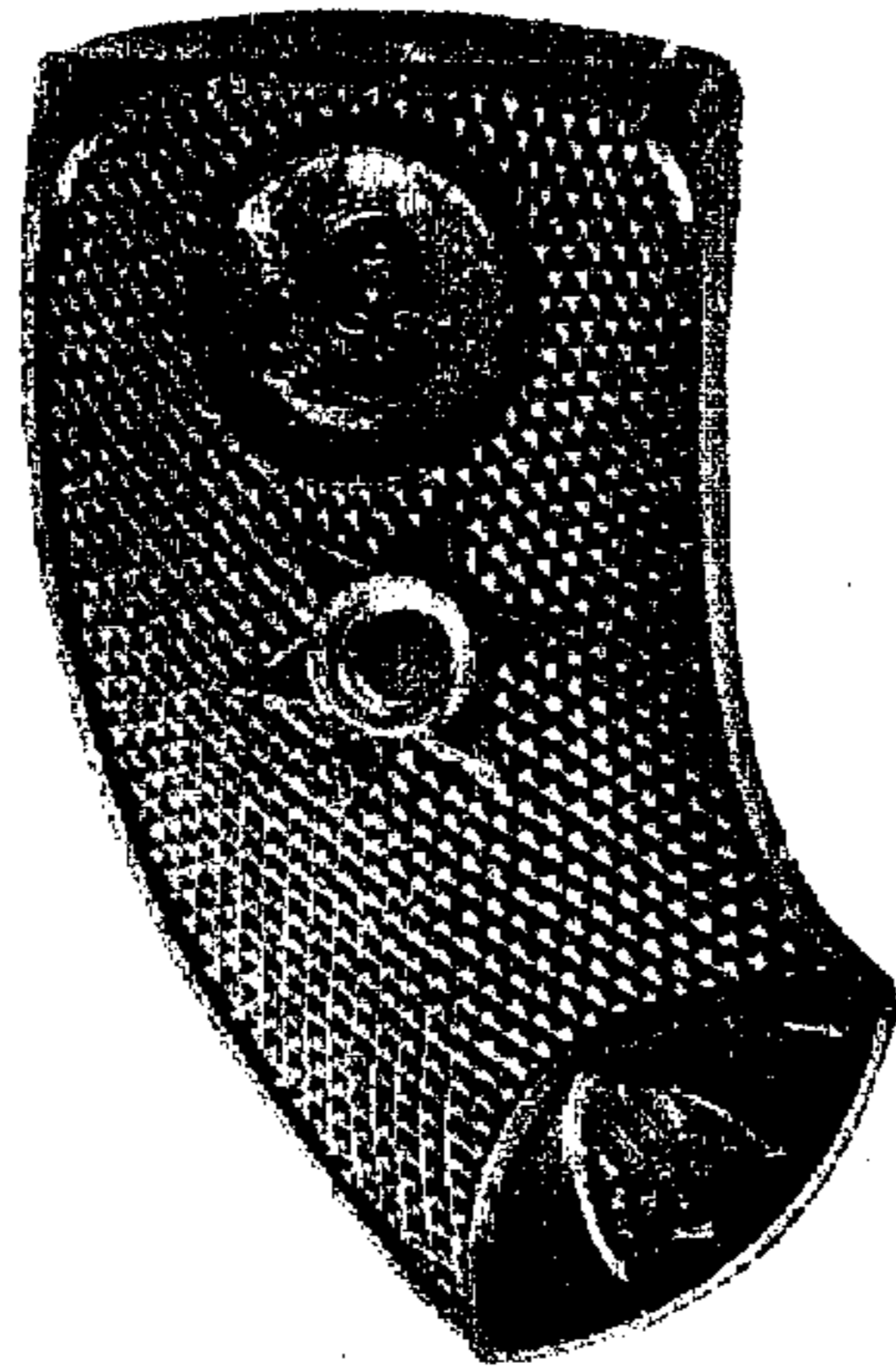

DESIGN FOR PISTOL-HANDLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,202**, dated May 20, 1879; application filed April 17, 1879.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM H. BLISS, of Norwich, in the county of New London and State of Connecticut, have originated and designed an ornamentation of a Pistol-Stock, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

A represents the stock or butt of a pistol; *a*, a medallion portrait, encircled by a raised rim. *b* is a star around the rivet-opening, and *c* is a shield.

I am aware that a medallion for portraits has been used for ornamentation of pistol-stocks, and this I do not, broadly, claim.

What I do claim as my invention is—

1. The design for ornamentation of a pistol-stock, composed of medallion portrait encircled by a raised plain rim, and located at the lower end of the handle, substantially as described, and illustrated in the accompanying photograph.

2. As a design for the ornamentation of a pistol-stock, the combination of the medallion portrait encircled by a raised rim, and located at the butt-end of the stock, the star-encircled rivet-hole, and the shield upon the beveled upper end, all as described, and shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
