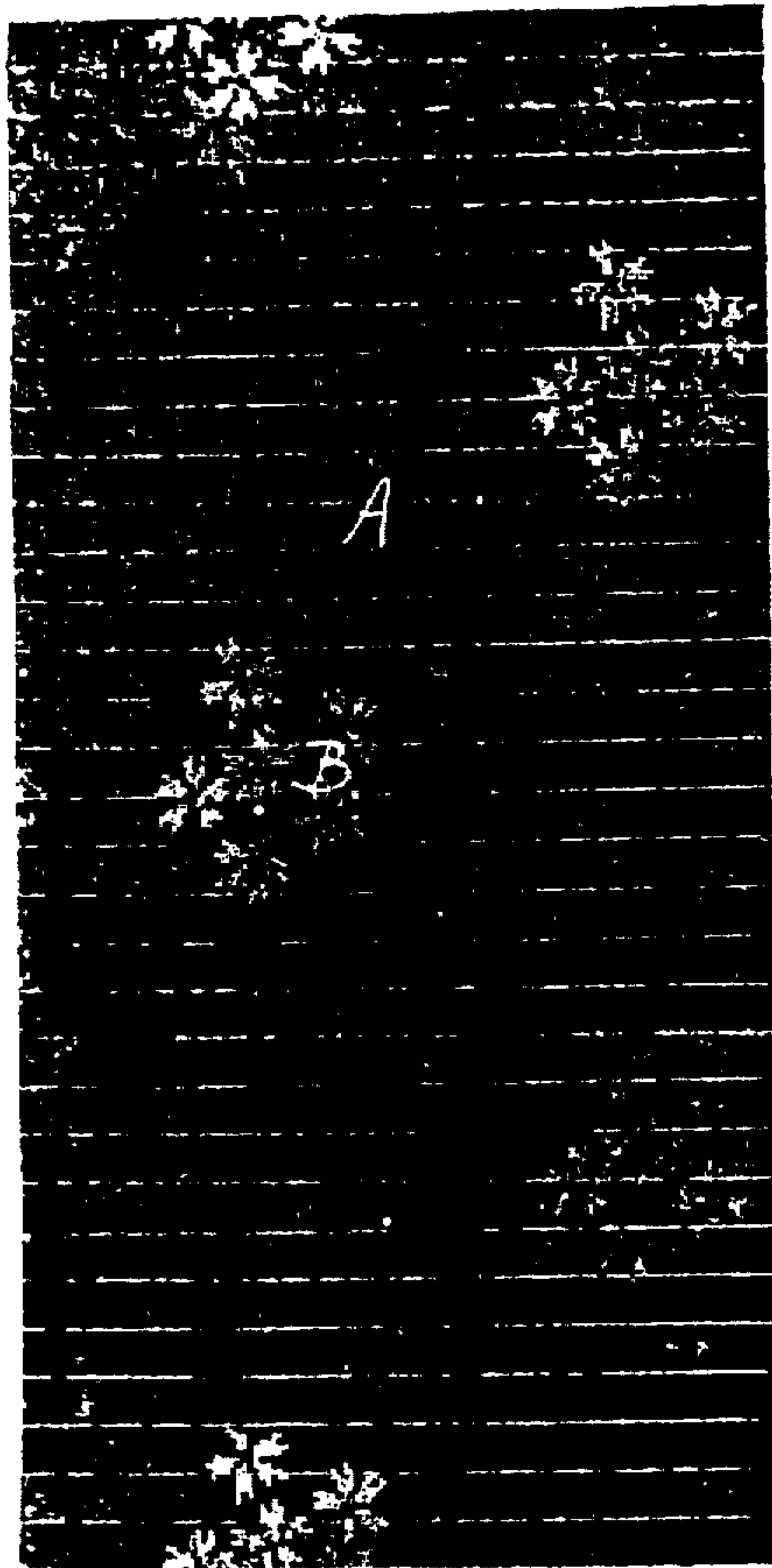

DESIGN FOR A CARPET.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 13,326, dated October 3, 1882.

Application filed August 11, 1882. Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, OTTO HEINIGKE, of New Utrecht, in the State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Carpets, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to a new and original design for carpets and similar fabrics; and it consists in the novel grouping and configuration of figures hereinafter more fully described.

10 The accompanying photograph illustrates a face view of a carpet having my new design.

15 The background A is closely and regularly filled with small spraying leaf forms, with inconspicuous branch connections, and with the interstices between the leaves filled with unconnected sprays and leaf forms and dots. At regular intervals over this ground are scattered the flower clusters B, each consisting of one

central and five outer flowers arranged irregularly around the central flower. These flowers are small five-petaled flowers, and are distinct in form and size from the leaf forms filling the background.

I claim—

1. The design for carpets, consisting of the ground A, substantially as shown.

2. The design for carpets, consisting of the figure B, substantially as shown.

3. The design for carpets, consisting of the ground A and the figure B, substantially as shown and described.
