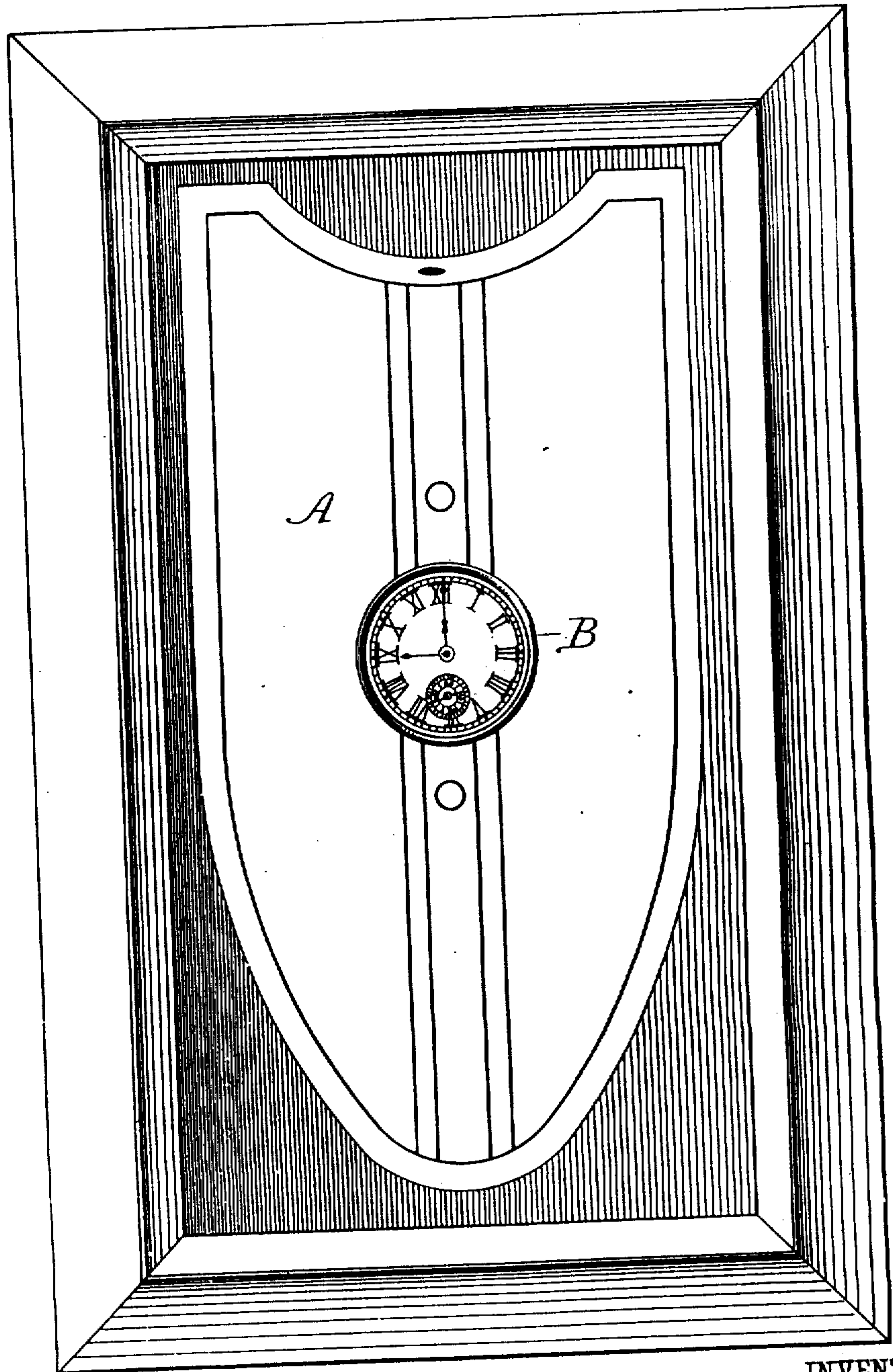

DESIGN FOR AN ADVERTISING-SIGN.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 15,991, dated March 24, 1885.

Application filed February 4, 1885. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NORVAL MARION HARRISON, a citizen of the United States, residing at Baltimore city, in the State of Maryland,
5 have invented and produced a new and original Design for Advertising-Signs, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

10 The figure is a front elevation of my new design for a sign.

It consists of a front view of a shirt-bosom having a clock-face with its dial and hands appearing within the contour of the shirt-bosom.

15 A is the representation of the shirt-bosom, and B is the clock-face, which elements together constitute the leading and essential feature of the design.

The shirt-bosom has a rounded lower end and a concave top or neck portion, and the whole is inclosed by a rectangular marginal frame.

What I claim is—

The design for an advertising-sign, consisting of a representation of a shirt-bosom having a rounded lower end, and a concave top or neck part having a clock-face within the contour of the same, the whole inclosed within a rectangular marginal frame, as shown and described.
