

DESIGN FOR A FIRE-PLACE LINING.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,153, dated July 7, 1835.

Application filed May 15, 1885. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, James Austin Page, a citizen of the United States, residing at Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Ornamental Fire-Place Linings, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying photograph, forming a part to thereof.

The photograph gives a clear perspective view and shows completely the character of my new design in renascent art. In bas-relief a central ornamental column rests upon a fluted ogee base and terminates at the top with a front face sculptured form. This column supports renascent scrolls exactly alike on either side, the top ones terminating by a dragon's head, and the others more like rosettes, while intermediate are leaf-like forms,

and a small circling vine below the first rosette, and between the two lower rosettes, outwardly from the column, there are ornamental shapes somewhat resembling petals. The same remascent scrolls and ornaments in bas-relief are 25 repeated on each of the jambs of the fire-place; but the central column seen in the back is not repeated. The entire design is shown clearly in the photograph.

I claim—

The design for a fire-place lining, comprising the central column, the fluted ogee base, and top terminal of a front female face having a coronal ornament, remascent scrolls, and ornamentations, as shown and described.
