

DESIGN FOR A RUG.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,154, dated July 7, 1885.

Application filed May 7, 1885. Term of patent 34 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ADOLPH PETZOLD, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Rug, of which the following is a specification.

The accompanying illustration represents my rug with one of the end panels omitted, as :c it is a duplicate of the one shown.

My design consists of an outer broad border with a large central panel, shield-shaped figure, and two narrow crown shaped end panels. All these panels are bounded by scroll-shaped configurations, as will be seen in the accompanying illustration, and are ornamented within their borders, as will be hereinafter described.

A is the outer border; B, the central panel;

C, one of the end panels; D D D D, the scroll-20 shaped outlines of the panels; E, a central figure of the large panel B, formed of clustered leaves resembling a half-opened rose. This is surrounded with sprays of leaves on their stems in scroll form. The end panel, C, has 25 a central figure, F, with leaf-wings G G.

The leading features of my design are the outer border, A, central scroll-bounded shield-shaped panel, B, end crown shaped panels, C, and central figure, E, all ornamented substantially as shown.

What I claim as new is—

The design for rugs, substantially as shown and described.
