## DESIGN FOR A RUG.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,156, dated July 7, 1885.

Application filed April 11, 1885. Term of patent  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, ADOLPH PETZOLD, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented  
5 and produced a new and original Design for a Rug, of which the following is a specification.

The accompanying illustration represents one half of my design for a rug, the other half  
10 being a duplicate of that shown.

The design consists of an outer surrounding border, A, a central rectangular panel, B, containing within its borders small figures  
15 C C, resembling the fleur-de-lis, or bearing a general resemblance to the trefoil. There is a space surrounding this central panel and lying between it and the outer border, A.  
This space is narrow on the sides and wider at the ends. The wide space at each end is  
20 ornamented with a heraldic design consisting of a shield, D, surmounted by a plumed hel-

met, E, with crossed swords at the back of the shield, the hilts projecting beyond the upper corners thereof and the points below the lower corners. The face of the shield may be orna- 25 mented with small figures, as desired. I also interpose lines of leaves in the spaces between the sides of the central panel and the inner edge of the outer border, substantially as shown. 30

The leading features of my design are the outer border, A, a large central inner panel, B, and the end spaces, each ornamented with the heraldic design consisting of a shield sur- 35 mounted by a plumed helmet.

What I claim as new is—

The design for a rug, substantially as shown and described.
