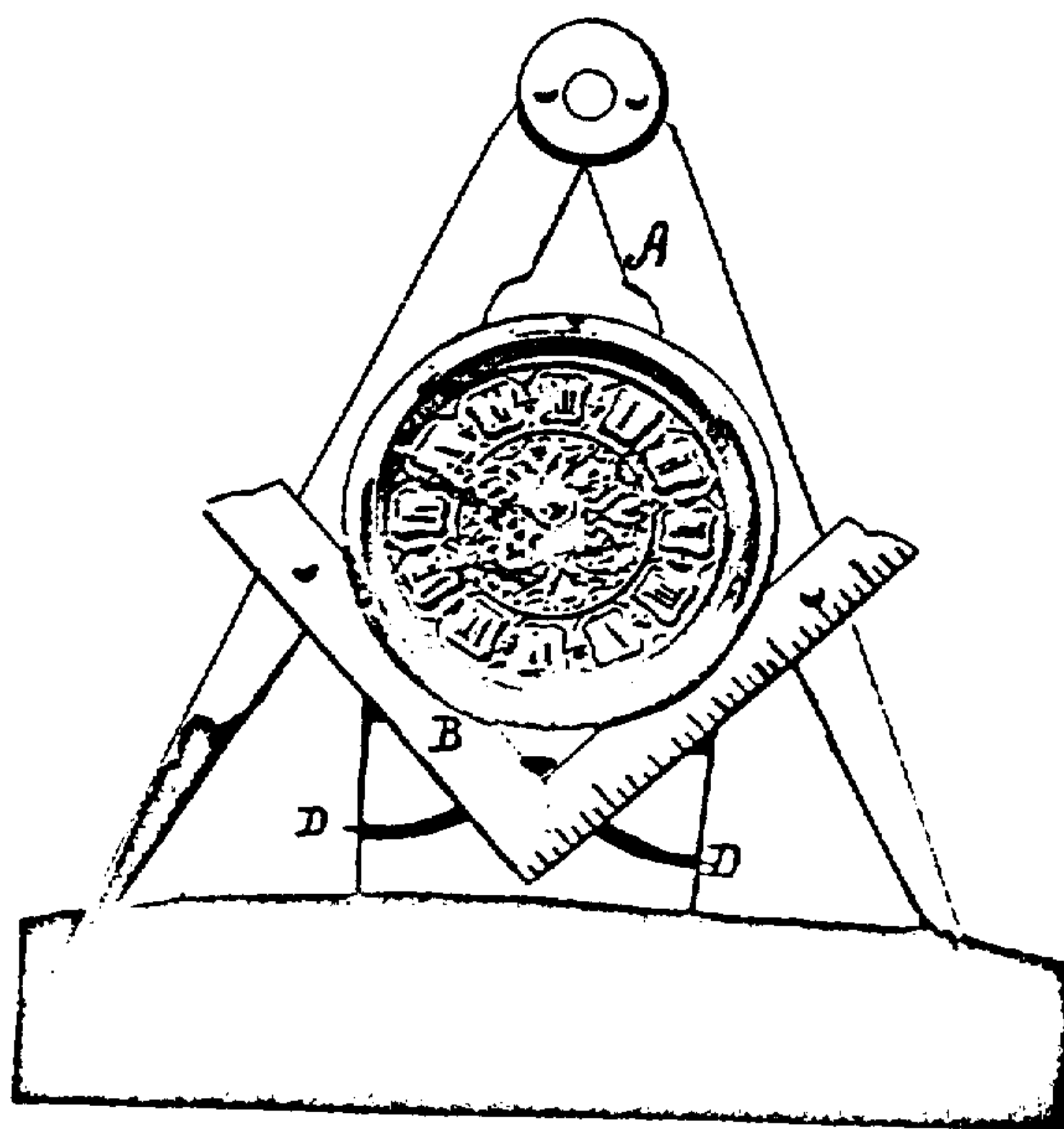

DESIGN FOR A CLOCK-STAND.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,157, dated July 7, 1885.

Application filed March 9, 1885. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM S. WEISS, a resident of New York city, in the county and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Clock-
5 Stand, of which the following is a full description, in connection with the accompanying photograph, which represents a perspective view of my new design for a clock-stand.

0 This invention relates to a new configuration of clock-stand, which consists in a clock-stand having the form of a pair of compasses, across the arms of which a carpenter's square is laid, as shown, the dial being embraced by
15 said square and said compasses.

In the accompanying photograph, the letter A represents the pair of compasses, the legs of

which diverge downwardly; the letter B, the carpenter's square, pointing downward; the letter C, the dial of the clock, which is embraced by said square and said compasses, and the letter D the support on which the clock-stand rests.

I claim—

The design for a clock-stand, the same consisting of a pair of compasses, A, square B, and dial C, the said dial being embraced by said square and said compasses, substantially
25 as shown.
