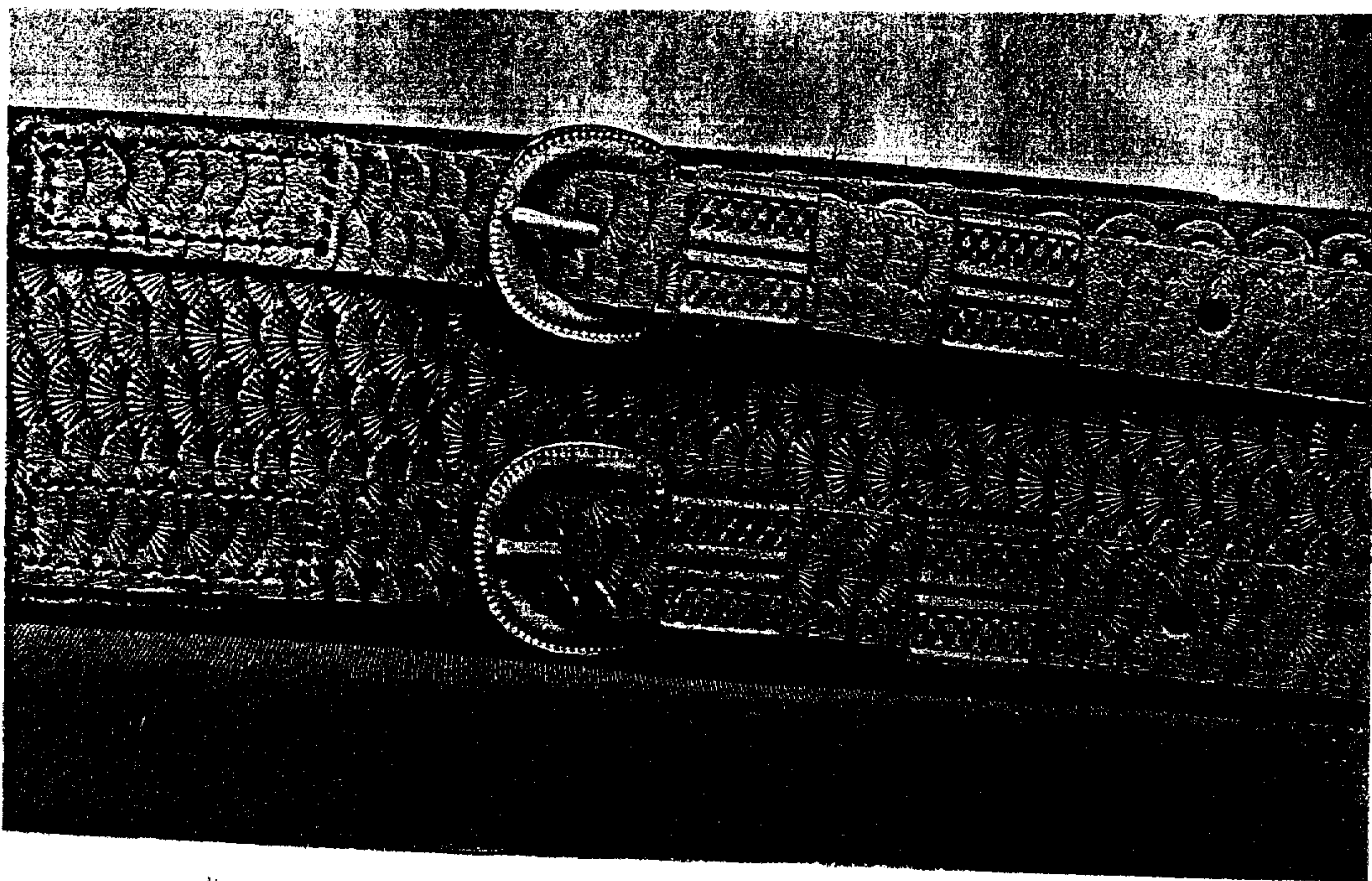

DESIGN FOR THE ORNAMENTATION OF A BELT.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,158, dated July 7, 1885.

Application filed April 9, 1885. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEOPOLD WERNER, a citizen of the United States, residing at Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Ornamentation of Ladies' Belts; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying photographic view, and to letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification.

The photograph represents a front view of my design, and is deemed sufficient to fully illustrate the same.

The leading features of my design consist in the horizontal parallel bands *a a*, the trans-

verse bands *b b b b*, and the raised work *c* upon the body *A* of the belt and upon said bands, said raised work having the appearance of fish-scales, all of which impart to the belt a unique and beautiful design.

I claim—

The design for ornamentation of ladies' belts herein shown and described, the same consisting of the horizontal and transverse parallel bands and raised work thereon and on the body having the appearance of fish-scales.
