DESIGN FOR HOSIERY.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,501, dated February 2, 1886.

Application filed December 4, 1885. Serial No. 184,755. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN PHIPPS, a citizen
of the United States, residing in Philadelphia,
Pennsylvania, have invented a new and origi-
5 nal Design for Hosiery, of which the following
is a specification.

My design for hosiery is fully shown in the
accompanying drawing. The ankle, heel, and
upper portion of the foot of the stocking are
10 plain; but in the sole-piece of the foot, and ex-
tending lengthwise of the latter below the cen-
tral seam, are a row of diamond-shaped figures,
a, and zigzag stripes *b*.

I do not claim, broadly, diamond-shaped
15 figures and zigzag stripes as ornamentation for
stockings; but

I claim—

A design for hosiery, said design consisting
of the plain ankle, heel and top of the foot,
and a row of diamond-shaped figures, *a*, and 20
zigzag stripes *b*, extending lengthwise of the
sole-piece of the foot, all substantially as de-
scribed and shown.
