

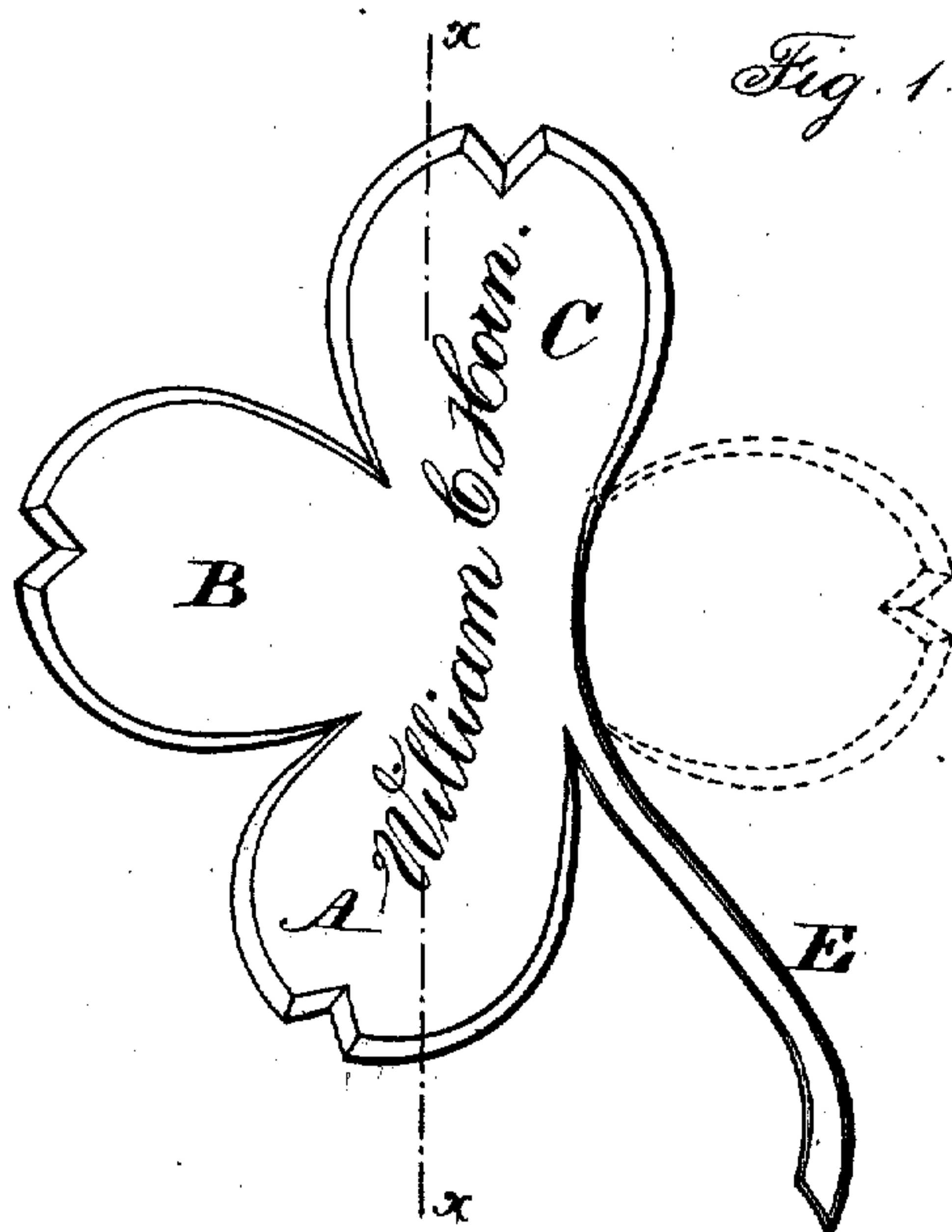

DESIGN FOR A NAME-PLATE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,689, dated May 18, 1886.

Application filed April 10, 1886. Serial No. 198,517. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM C. HORN, of Orange, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a Design for a Name-Plate, of which the following is a specification.

The leading features of this design consist of an ornamental name-plate having three or four sections adapted to the reception of one or more names, and having ornamental and artistic beauty.

In the drawings, Figure 1 is a plan view of the name-plate, and Fig. 2 is a section of the same.

The design of this name-plate consists in the foliated configuration represented, the portions A B C each being nearly circular and notched at the outer edges and merging together as one name-plate, and the stem portion E passes off obliquely, the whole being a

conventional imitation clover-leaf, the edges of the plate being beveled, as represented in Fig. 2.

In this design there are either three foliations, as shown by the full lines, or four, as indicated by the dotted lines, the whole forming a neat and artistic configuration or design for a name-plate.

I claim—

The design for a name-plate, consisting of a foliated configuration having a beveled edge in conventional imitation of clover-leaves, each leaf having a notch on the outer extremity, substantially as described and shown.
