

## DESIGN FOR A PICTURE OR LOOKING-GLASS FRAME.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,965, dated November 2, 1886.

Application filed August 17, 1886. Serial No. 211,166. Term of patent 3½ years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, BENJAMIN S. DONAHUE, a citizen of the United States, residing at Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for the Ornamentation of Picture-Frames and Looking-Glasses, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a general view of my new design for picture-frames or looking-glasses. Fig. 2 is a side elevation of the same, these two views being deemed necessary to fully illustrate my design.

In the drawings, A represents a frame of

any suitable dimensions, with a central opening, B, intended for the reception of the picture or mirror, as may be desired. On the upper part of the frame a figure, C, representing a kitten is mounted, as shown.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new therein, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for the ornamentation of picture or mirror frames herein shown and described, the same consisting of a frame having the figure of a kitten mounted thereon.
