DESIGN FOR A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,988, dated November 16, 1886.

Application filed February 10, 1886. Serial No. 191,518. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CARL SCHRAUBSTADTER, Jr., a citizen of the United States, residing in the city of St. Louis, Missouri, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Font of Printing-Type, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying impression, forming part thereof.

My design relates to that style of type in o which very heavy and very light lines are used

in forming the letters.

The leading or characteristic feature of my design consists in the terminal of certain of the heavy standards at points where they intersect with the standards formed by the light lines. This feature is found in the A, K, M, N, R, V, and W, in which the heavy standards are indicated by a, the light standards by b, and the terminal referred to by c.

Another feature characteristic of the design appears in the C, E, F, G, L, S, T, and Z, in

which the inclined terminals d extend in a straight line beyond the bars, which they terminate, and then back to said bars, forming the triangular projections or points e.

I claim—

The design for a font of printing-type herein shown and described, consisting of the bold-faced horizontally extended letters having very heavy and very light contrasting lines, 30 the CEFGLSTZ having the pointed projection e, the E and F having the horizontally-extended middle bar, the AMNVW having the terminal c, extending beyond the intersecting light line, and the KR having a similar 35 terminal upon the heavy inclined bar extending beyond the intersecting beyond the intersecting light bar.
